

In the Gospel for this First Sunday of Lent we hear Luke's version of the story of Jesus being led by the Spirit into the desert for forty days, to be tempted by the devil. Jesus overcomes all the temptations presented to him as he places his trust in God and follows the commands of God. Although we do not physically have to go to the desert, we are given this forty day period of Lent to confront our own temptations and deepen our trust in God. Let us remember that the same Spirit that led Jesus through his temptations, is also there to lead us. How do we call upon the Holy Spirit on our journey of faith? What temptations do we need to confront? In what ways do we need to be cleansed and purified during these forty days? Through the power of the Holy Spirit, may this season of Lent lead us closer to Christ.

This weekend, the **catechumens and candidates** from our parish will be celebrating the **Rite of Election** with Bishop Johnston at the Cathedral with others from around the diocese preparing to enter the Catholic Church at Easter. We are blessed by the presence of these catechumens and candidates in our community. Please keep them in your prayers.

This Sunday, March 10, join us for our parish St. Joseph Table. The traditional pasta meal will be served from 11:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. You are asked to make a free will donation for the meal. There will also be delicious cookies and baked goods available for sale. The St. Joseph Table is rooted in a long tradition of honoring St. Joseph, praying for his intercession, and giving to those in need. All proceeds this year will go to help the homeless through our service partner, Uplift Organization. A big thanks to our 6th grade teachers, April Haggerty, Susie Kenney, and Amy Matlock, and their students and families, for all their work in organizing the event.

All parishes in our diocese are participating in *The Light is On for You* program which encourages participation in the Sacrament of Reconciliation during Lent. At Presentation, besides our usual weekend times for Reconciliation, we have added times on Monday and Friday mornings and Wednesday evenings during the Lenten season. 

Primer Domingo de Cuaresma

"Tiempo de tentación y de purificación"

Queridos hermanos y hermanas, hace unos días dábamos inicio a la cuaresma el cual es un tiempo de conversión. De confrontarnos con nosotros mismos y de reconocernos tal cual somos. Ver aquello que nos aleja de Dios para desterrarlo de nuestra vida.

Como todos los años, el primer Domingo de Cuaresma, nos encontramos con el relato de las tentaciones de Jesús en el desierto. Al leer el pasaje de las tentaciones observamos que en los relatos de Mateo y Lucas aparecen explicadas las tentaciones que sufrió nuestro Señor. En Marcos, simplemente se nos dice que fue tentado. La tentación forma parte de nosotros. Nos ayuda a crecer, a purificarnos. Jesús se solidariza con todos nosotros y nos muestra que podemos superar nuestras tentaciones. Ya que Cristo "ha sido probado en todo como nosotros, excepto en el pecado" (Hbr 4, 15).

Jesús se retira al desierto después de ser bautizado. La plenitud del Espíritu lo arrastra, lo "empuja" textualmente. Y esta será una constante en su vida pública. Jesús se deja mover por el Espíritu. Es un continuo descentrarse, por medio del Espíritu, para centrarse en Dios, en el Padre. Cuando Jesús se retira, en su interior se encuentra sólo frente a Dios. Y en ese tiempo del desierto, no debemos ver sólo un tiempo de tentación, sino también de purificación. Purificarse para llevar a cabo el proyecto de Dios y realizar su voluntad. Los cuarenta días nos hacen recordar tanto el diluvio como el peregrinar por el desierto. Son momentos en los que se lleva a cabo esa purificación.

Vemos también en Jesús como un "nuevo Adán" en medio del paraíso rodeado de "alimañas" o "animales del campo". Las fieras se vuelven aliadas del hombre. Es una imagen de los tiempos mesiánicos donde se restablecería el orden de la creación. Pero empieza de forma silenciosa y no en un vergel, sino en el desierto. Esta parte termina con los ángeles sirviendo al Señor. Los ángeles aparecen en contraposición de Satanás. Uno tienta y pone a prueba, mientras que los otros sirven y nos revelan a Jesús como el Hijo. Son signo de la ayuda de Dios en nuestros momentos de debilidad y tentación. Él no nos abandona. Venceremos en nuestras tentaciones, si como Jesús, somos fieles a Dios por encima de las sugerencias de poder y de gloria que el Mundo nos ofrece.

Jesús inicia su vida pública y su misión principal, o casi

podríamos decir exclusiva: el anuncio del Reino. Apresado Juan el Bautista, marcha a su tierra a proclamar la Buena Noticia, el Evangelio de Dios. Se ha cumplido el plazo. Aquello que esperábamos ya llega, está entre nosotros, aunque no lo veamos. Está actuando ahora mismo y afecta a toda la historia. Y las indicaciones de Jesús son bastante sencillas con respecto a la actitud que debemos tomar: conversión y creer aquello que nos anuncia. Es un tiempo de conversión. De confrontarnos con nosotros mismos y de reconocernos tal cual somos. Ver aquello que nos aleja de Dios para desterrarlo de nuestra vida. Pero es también un tiempo de júbilo, ya que la espera se ha terminado. Es momento de acoger con alegría el reinado de Dios en nuestros corazones. Porque la Cuaresma es un purificarnos para llenarnos de Dios. Un camino que pasa por la Cruz para llegar a la Resurrección.





March 6, 2019 Ash Wednesday

Dear Friends in Christ,

As we begin the holy season of Lent today on this Ash Wednesday, I proclaim a Holy Year of Renewal as a special time for our local Church, the Diocese of Kansas City-St.

Joseph. The purpose of this Holy Year will allow us to prepare together to respond to the Holy Spirit's inspirations to pursue the priorities and goals in our Mutually Shared Vision to be One Family: Restored in Christ-Equipped for Mission. The Holy Year begins today at the beginning of Lent, a season of renewal marked by prayer, sacrifice and works of mercy. It is a time when we intentionally align our minds and our wills with our Lord. I ask that we all do so together, and this year, with the added desire to renew our homes, our parishes, and our diocese with the Mutually Shared Vision as both a road map and rallying cry in our commitments in achieving for the next few years.

The Holy Year will conclude next January 12, 2020, on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. This date was chosen so that we might all intentionally respond in a renewed way to the baptismal call we each received to be "priest, prophet and king" and to embrace our call to serve and grow God's Kingdom on earth, healing and building up our family, the Church.
