Jesus speaks about the cost of discipleship in today's Gospel. He reminds the great crowds who are following him that the path will not be easy. What are we to make of these words from Jesus that seem harsh and direct? Jesus is clear that he is not looking to be a popular attraction who people can follow casually. To follow the way of Jesus, one must be willing to give up relationships, possessions, and life itself. There is a depth of commitment required of those who choose to follow. We are called to turn away from our former ways and invest ourselves fully in the new life Christ promises us. With the parables Jesus uses in the Gospel, he encourages those who wish to follow him to calculate the cost and reflect on whether they are up for the challenge. But while the road may be demanding, the journey leads to eternal life with Christ.

As we strive to bring ongoing faith formation opportunities to our parishioners, I want to invite all adults of the parish to be part of our next ALPHA groups which will be forming this fall. Alpha is an international faith formation program that allows participants to learn more about their faith, grow in their relationship with Christ, and deepen their relationship with others. Alpha will be one of the programs our diocese suggests for use in parishes as our Diocesan Visioning Plan is implemented. We are fortunate to already be offering the program. We had about 60 people participate in our first groups last spring and they will provide some of the leadership for our new groups. You can sign up for a group that is convenient for your schedule and invite your spouses and friends to join you. There is no cost for Alpha, only a commitment of your time. More information about Alpha can be found in the bulletin or by contacting Mary Pat Storms.

Get your tickets after Mass to our annual Parish Fiesta (Fiesta Hispana) being held next Saturday, September 14. 

Vigésimo Tercer Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

Queridos amigos en Cristo, celebramos este domingo el vigésimo tercer domingo del tiempo ordinario. Jesús nos invita en el evangelio a poner los ojos en lo que de verdad vale la pena, a ver lo que perdura para siempre y solo cuando ponemos nuestros ojos en lo eterno será cuando nos acercaremos más a Dios.

Jesús siempre va a lo esencial. Él, que conoce el corazón del hombre, sabe que, desde Adán, nuestro más grave mal es el deseo de sobresalir. Sin embargo, nunca es más grande el hombre que cuando se siente pequeño delante de Dios. La humildad es su lugar, pues no puede exhibir delante de Dios ningún derecho. Todo lo que es y tiene lo ha recibido: ¿De qué enorgullecerse? (1 Cor 4,7). Y, por otra parte, ¿qué son todas las grandezas humanas al lado del puesto en que hemos sido colocados por aracia junto a los santos, los ángeles y el mismo Dios? El que se humilla, será ensalzado. Como tantas otras palabras del evangelio, esta frase nos da un verdadero retrato del propio Cristo. sobremanera y le ha concedido una gloria impensable (Fil 2,6-11). Él nos enseña por dónde se alcanza ese oculto deseo de gloria que todos llevamos dentro. La humillación es el único camino, no hay otro. Cristo quiere desengañarnos y lo hace convirtiéndose él en modelo y caminando por delante.

La última parte del evangelio nos recuerda: ¡Cuántos actos inútiles y sin provecho para la vida eterna porque buscamos de mil maneras recompensa y paga de los hombres!


