

Fr.Tom's

In the Gospel this weekend, Jesus opens the eyes of a man born blind. The story begins with the disciples asking Jesus: Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind? Jesus quickly dispels this commonly held belief of his time by saying that neither sinned. The mercy of God that Jesus shares turns everything upside down and allows those who experience it to see everything differently. Jesus goes further by saying that the works of God will be made visible through the healing of the blind man and help reveal Jesus as the light of the world. This powerful story is an invitation for all of us to see with the eyes of faith. Most of us will never have to deal with physical blindness. We often take our physical sight for granted, but spiritual blindness is something that affects all of us at times. This season of Lent is a time for our eyes to be opened so that we may recognize the presence of Jesus in our midst. In what ways are we being invited to see more clearly with the eyes of faith?

Our lives are certainly being turned upside down by the coronavirus crisis. Things may have changed again from the time I am writing this to the time you are reading it. And most of you are probably reading this through our website as we were not able to have public celebrations of Mass this weekend and do not anticipate being able to do so for at least a couple of more weeks. Just a reminder that the Bishop has extended the dispensation for all the faithful from the Sunday Mass obligation at this time. I can tell you that in my 24 years of priesthood I have never experienced anything like this. The life of the parish is just not the same without having parishioners at our Mass celebrations and without being able to connect through our weekly events and ministries. Please know how much I miss seeing you. Fr. Olvin and I have still been celebrating Masses and offering prayers for all of you. We encourage you to join us for weekend Mass through the video recording available on our website, www.olpls.org. We hope this will provide some comfort during these difficult times and allow us to stay connected to one another through the prayer of the Mass. As a sacramental church, I know how important the reception of Holy Communion is to our faith life. Although we will not be able to offer the physical reception of the Body & Blood of Jesus at this time, I hope as you watch the Mass you will take a moment at the time for Communion and allow the spiritual presence of Jesus to enter your life in a special way. One of the best ways for us to stay connected during this time of social distancing and limited gatherings is through

our prayer. Let us keep one another in our daily prayers. I hope you will take advantage of the Lenten prayer resources we handed out and the Best Lent Ever videos and journals. The church will also be open certain hours during the day and on weekends to allow times for private prayer and devotions. Please check the website or call the Parish Office for the specific times and for other updates.

Our parish Lenten Reconciliation service was scheduled for this Sunday, March 22. The service has been cancelled due to the current restrictions. We will be offering opportunities to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation during the week and on weekends. Please check the website for the specific times. If you do come to church for Reconciliation and there is a line, please observe the social distancing recommendations when ground others.

As we all make adjustments and sacrifices to our lives and strive to stay healthy, let us be people of hope and prayer, especially as we pray for each other, for those affected by the virus, for all the caregivers, and for a speedy end to the spread of the virus. And as our schedules and routines are changed dramatically, let's use this time to slow down and deepen our relationship with God, our families, friends, and one another.

March 28 Read and reflect John 7:40-41

1. Call the Missouri Child Abuse Hotline at 1.800.392.3738 (if the victim is currently under the age of 18), and

2. Contact your local law enforcement agency or call 911, and

3. After reporting to these civil and law enforcement authorities, report suspected sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult to the Diocesan Ombudsman, Joe Crayon, at 816-812-2500 or crayon@ombudsmankcsj.org, if the abuse involves a priest, deacon, employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph.




