Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And you shall renew the face of the earth. Today we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost and this prayer reminds us of the power of the Holy Spirit who fills us with God's love and renews all things in God's name. Pentecost means "Fiftieth Day" and brings our celebration of the Easter season to a close. The Easter season this year has certainly seemed different as we have not been able to gather for Mass publicly for the entire season. But hopefully we have found time during this pandemic and its disruption to the flow of our lives to draw strength from our faith in the Risen Lord. And this year, maybe more than others, we need to remember that Jesus promises to be with us always through the gift of the Holy Spirit. The Feast of Pentecost celebrates that Jesus is present to his followers in a new way and the life of the Church takes shape. So this ending also marks a beginning as we call



upon the Spirit to strengthen us to use our gifts to spread the good news of Jesus. As we hear in the Gospel today, like the first disciples we have all received the gift of the Holy Spirit through Christ. How might the Spirit be calling us to use our gifts?

Thank you to those who attended and helped with our 3 in-person Masses last weekend. This slow re-opening of Masses gave us the opportunity to test our procedures and help ensure the health and safety of those attending. For the most part, everything went very well. A big thanks to many on our parish staff who were present to assist with the Masses and for their dedication and commitment during this difficult time.

This weekend we will be celebrating 4 in-person Masses. Our Saturday afternoon Mass is reserved for those joining the Catholic faith along with their sponsors and families. One of the Sunday Masses is a First Communion Mass for some of the children who attend our Spanish Mass. The other 2 Masses were open to parishioners who let us know they would like to attend through an email response earlier in the week. Again, we used our random selection program to choose those invited as we follow the current limited capacity guidelines. While we wish we could just have open Masses for anyone who would like to attend, we thank you for your patience as we try to accommodate the requests and follow the guidelines and restrictions that are in place.

Next weekend, June 6-7, we will be offering 5 Masses with the Sunday 2:00 p.m. Mass reserved for another group of First Communion children and their families. Please respond to the Constant Contact email that will come out at the beginning of the week if you would like to attend one of the other Masses. As I have mentioned previously, our Sunday Mass times will need to change temporarily so we can have adequate time to clean between Masses. The Mass times will be 8:00 a.m., 10:00 a.m. and Noon in English. The Saturday Mass time will remain at 4:30 p.m. We will also be doing Sunday afternoon Masses in Spanish and for our First Communion children.

Beginning this Tuesday, June 2, we will begin opening our 8:15am daily Mass for those who would like to attend. All the guidelines for attending Mass will be in effect. This includes wearing a mask, social distancing of 6 feet, and sitting in designated pews. Please review the "Guidelines for returning to public Mass" information on our website. At this time, you do not need to reserve a spot to attend daily Mass, but we will be monitoring the size of the crowd.

Please be sure to attend one of our Pentecost Parking Lot Prayer Services this weekend – there is one on Saturday, May 30 at 6:00 p.m. and Sunday, May 31 at 10:00 a.m. Join us as we call upon the gifts of the Holy Spirit, offer a blessing of graduates and have a mini-Variety Show that includes an act from some of our staff. You can also bring items for the Lee's Summit Social Services food drive. We hope to see you there.



Work is starting on our next phase! Finish work is starting on the classrooms on the south end to transform them into offices for our Children's Faith Formation and for meeting spaces. Work is also happening to begin moving components so that we can have a Gathering Space that flows into the back of our church worship space.

Part-time School Year Position

This position is a good fit for college students or adults seeking a part-time position with consistent hours, who enjoy working with children. Teaching or childcare experience is preferred.

OLP School has openings for part-time childcare teachers in our afterschool care program (ACED), for children in Kindergarten - 8th Grade for the 2020-2021 school year, August - May.

ACED is open 3:00 to 6:00pm on school days, with occasional half days (Noon to 6:00pm) and occasional full days (6:30am to 6:00pm). Staff members are typically scheduled 10-15 hours per week. We strive to keep a balance of male and female staff, to maintain safe environment guidelines.

Applicants must be at least 18 years of age, enjoy working with children, and able to complete diocesan requirements for safe environment training, including a background check. We are seeking reliable, energetic and self-motivated leaders, as the pace is quite active. ACED staff members work as a team, actively supervising 85-110 children daily, including snack time, play time, and assistance with homework.
