This weekend we enter a stretch of Ordinary Time that falls between the Christmas season and the beginning of Lent. A resource I read recently put it this way: After the lights and carols of Christmas, Ordinary Time – which actually means counted time (we number the weeks) - can seem so, well, ordinary. But it is in the ordinary days of our ordinary lives that God asks us to build his Kingdom. This weekend we hear about the importance of being called. First, Samuel is called by the Lord and answers readily with: Here I am. You called me. In the Gospel, John the Baptist identifies Jesus as the Lamb of God and immediately two of John's disciples begin to follow Jesus. Andrew, one of the two, finds his own brother Simon Peter and tells him: We have found the Messiah. The call of God comes in different ways, sometimes dramatic and sometimes in the ordinary events of our day to day experiences. Regardless of how we are called, it should lead us to respond with our lives and share the good news of Jesus with others. And, like Andrew, we all have a duty to assist our brothers and sisters on their journey of faith.

This is an **exciting time of year** as many children, teens, and adults are preparing to receive Sacraments. We have nearly 100 children preparing for their First Eucharist and many of them received their First Reconciliation earlier this month. Our high school teens preparing for the Sacrament of Confirmation will begin their formation sessions later this month. We also have a number of adults and their families preparing to be received into the Catholic Church at Easter. Please keep all of them in your prayers.

At the end of January each year, we kick-off the annual celebration of Catholic Schools Week. For several years now, we have also been using this as a time to highlight our **OLP Endowment Fund for Catholic Education**. Contributions to this Fund allow us to provide scholarships to students who would not otherwise be able to attend a Catholic school. Please make a contribution by using the designated envelope in your January packet, by going to our website to give OnLine, or by placing your contribution in your own envelope clearly marked for the Endowment. We appreciate your support of our parish grade school.

This week there are several observances that need our prayer and attention. This Monday, January 18, is the national observance of **Martin Luther King**, **Jr**. More than ever, we need prayers to end the racial hatred and division in our nation. Let us use MLK Day to reflect on ways we can unite instead of divide.



Ministerio Hispano

Hermanos en el evangelio de hoy, se nos presentan dos momentos en la vida de Juan y Andrés, discípulos del Bautista. El primero: su encuentro con Jesús; y el segundo: la respuesta natural que nace de este encuentro.

Juan y Andrés siguen a Jesús, en un momento. Éste se vuelve y les pregunta ¿Qué buscan? Los discípulos después le responden con otra pregunta. Pero la respuesta que Cristo les da parece que no resuelve su interrogante. Sin embargo, la pedagogía de Jesús es diferente a la nuestra. Les invita a que ellos mismos hagan la experiencia de convivir con Él. No los fuerza. Respeta profundamente su libertad. Hasta el punto que ellos mismos vieron dónde vivía y decidieron permanecer con Él. Lo que les atrajo no era tanto el lugar donde vivía el Maestro, eso más bien era un pretexto para acercarse a Él y conocerlo más íntimamente. Su testimonio les impactó tanto que interiormente lo único que deseaban era quedarse a su lado.

Nadie puede hacer una verdadera experiencia de Cristo y no quedar con alguna huella visible. En este evangelio, se nos muestra cómo el conocimiento de Cristo les lleva a tener una necesidad muy grande de trasmitirlo a los demás. El mismo Andrés no duda en llevar la buena noticia de que han encontrado al Mesías a su hermano Simón, para después presentarlo con el Señor y que Cristo lo escoja para seguirlo también. El apostolado brota en todo corazón como una exigencia de quien ha experimentado el amor de Dios en su alma y desea ardientemente que los demás también puedan gozar de este maravilloso encuentro, sepan buscar y encontrar.

El papa Benedicto XVI nos recuerda que la palabra "Cristo" (Mesías) significa "el Ungido". La humanidad de Jesús está insertada, mediante la unidad del Hijo con el Padre, en la comunión con el Espíritu Santo y, así, es "ungida" de una manera única, y penetrada por el Espíritu Santo. Lo que había sucedido en los

reyes y sacerdotes del Antiguo Testamento de modo simbólico en la unción con aceite, con la que se les establecía en su ministerio, sucede en Jesús en toda su realidad: su humanidad es penetrada por la fuerza del Espíritu Santo. Cuanto más nos unimos a Cristo, más somos colmados por su Espíritu, por el Espíritu Santo. Nos llamamos "cristianos", "ungidos", personas que pertenecen a Cristo y por eso participan en su unción, son tocadas por su Espíritu. No quiero sólo llamarme cristiano, sino que quiero serlo, decía san Ignacio de Antioquía. Dejemos que precisamente estos santos óleos, que ahora son consagrados, nos recuerden esta tarea inherente a la palabra "cristiano", y pidamos al Señor para que no sólo nos llamemos cristianos, sino que lo seamos verdaderamente cada vez más.

After reporting to these civil and law enforcement authorities, report suspected sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult to the Diocesan Ombudsman, Joe Crayon, 816-812-2500, or <u>crayon@ombudsmankcsj.org</u>, if the abuse involves a priest, deacon, employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph.




