Celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation during Lent

The Gospel for this **Third Sunday of Lent** is the story of the cleansing of the Temple in Jerusalem. Jesus drove out the marketplace that had been set up in the temple area and overturned the tables saying: Take these out of here, and stop making my Father's house a marketplace. Jesus was seeking to restore the religious nature of the Temple and allow those who entered to focus on their relationship with God. Jesus also uses this incident to foretell his Resurrection and identify himself as the new Temple of God. Jesus is reminding us that if we truly want to encounter God, it is not about a physical structure, but about entering into life with him. The season of Lent is an opportunity to turn away from the marketplace that rises up all around us and focus on deepening our relationship with Christ. How can we more fully live the values of the Temple (our faith) as we continue our Lenten journey?

Just a reminder to take advantage of our Lenten offerings. Join us for **Stations of the Cross** every Friday at 6:30 p.m. – in church or the parking lot. Attend **daily Mass** at 8:15 a.m. Monday - Friday or at 6:30 a.m. Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Participate in our **Monday Faith Feeds** on Zoom and take time for some reflection and music with our **Agape Wednesday** services that are available through our Constant Contacts and on our website. If you have felt a little disconnected from your faith or not been back to church in a while, Lent is a great time for renewal. Make a commitment to do something concrete to grow in your faith this Lent.

Back in December, Pope Francis designated this the **Year of St. Joseph** for our universal Catholic Church. St. Joseph is an example for all of us in our faith and models our call to trust in God. As the Feast of St. Joseph falls during the month of March (19) and St. Joseph is the co-patron of our diocese, our Bishop has asked that parishes in our diocese recite the **Litany of St. Joseph** a few minutes before the beginning of each weekend Mass. We will begin this weekend. Let us call upon the intercession of St. Joseph on our journey of faith.



What is a Scrutiny?

March 7, at the 8 am Mass, we celebrated a Scrutiny with those preparing to join the Church at Easter.

Ordinarily, there are three Scrutinies during Lent, but this year, because of Covid-19,
at the direction of Bishop Johnston, we will celebrate only one Scrutiny.

During the scrutiny, those preparing for Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil stand with their sponsors while the presider and assembly pray over them, asking God to strengthen and assist them to more clearly live out God's love. At this time, these individuals are also invited, with God's help, to turn away from sin and evil. The scrutinies are celebrated in order to deliver the elect from the power of sin and Satan, to protect them against temptation, and give them strength in Christ.

First, those joining the Church are gathered within the assembly. They are already part of the established prayer life of the Church, learning in the way the Church prays, lives, and breathes.

Second, the local church prays for and over these elect. Hands are symbolically laid on them in prayer, suggesting that the Church is not only asking God's strength and assistance—the Church itself is there to be a sign and presence of strength, especially in the face of trial. It is a healing touch.

Third, the entire Church has the opportunity to consider its need for God's help to be healed and strengthened. Those joining the Church are not the only ones in need of God's assistance.

Each person in the assembly needs to continuously look to God as they try to resist sin and evil. As the assembly participates in the scrutiny, we should examine our "schooling" in the love of God. All Christian disciples need to continually examine how they are open to participating in God's love.

This rite is a witness to the "skills" (prayers) needed to live daily what Christian discipleship is.
