



Fr.Tom's thoughts

The Gospel for this Fourth Sunday of Lent begins with the Pharisees and scribes complaining about Jesus by saying: This man welcomes sinners and eats with them. This complaint leads Jesus to tell the parable of the Prodigal Son. This is one of the most widely known stories in the Gospels. Everyone can relate to the story in some way. Whether we have felt like the younger son who squandered his inheritance but then longed to return home or the older son who was resentful of his younger brother, we can all find hope in the unconditional love of the father. No one is outside the wideness of God's mercy. We are reminded that God always welcomes us back with open arms. In God's eyes, what is lost must be found. As we cherish the mercy and forgiveness extended to us, let us imitate the way of the Father and extend mercy and forgiveness to one another.

This Fourth Sunday of Lent is also known as *Laetare Sunday*. Laetare means "*Rejoice*" and helps set a tone of joyful anticipation in a season that is otherwise focused on repentance and preparation. As Easter draws nearer, let us always remember that there is reason for us to rejoice as we look forward to the fullness of new life offered to us by Christ. Go out and do something joyful today to celebrate!

This time of year includes a lot of things that can get our attention – spring weather, spring break, spring training (looks like baseball is going to happen), and March Madness! In the midst of all of this, let's remember that nothing can impact and change our lives like a meaningful Lent. Stay focused, take advantage of our Lenten offerings, and finish strong!



What is a synod?

A synod is a meeting or assembly of church leaders and laity of the church. It is a model that includes listening to a broad range of people and then discussing the issues together with the goal of hearing where the Holy Spirit is calling the church. Pope Francis began this two-year global synodal process "Communion, Participation, and Mission" with a Mass at the Vatican on October 10. Every diocese and parish around the world has been invited to participate by holding their own local synod listening session.



Why the Stations of the Cross?

Along with icons, stained glass, and statues, it's easy to overlook the other collection of images that decorate most Catholic Churches: the Stations of the Cross. "The Way of the Cross" (in Latin, Via Crucis; or the Via Dolorosa, the "Way of Sorrows") is a devotion that traces the last stage of the journey that Jesus walked in his earthly life: from the Garden of Olives through his death on the Cross.

Where did this practice come from?

Traditions tell of the early Christians retracing the steps of Christ and pilgrims walking this way in Jerusalem. Around the 17th century, knowing that many Christians couldn't travel to the Holy Land, permission was given to local parishes to start creating their own "Stations" of the Cross. We have practiced this tradition (especially during Lent) ever since!




