This weekend we focus on new beginnings. We begin a **new Church year** and we begin the **season of Advent**. The new Church year invites us into another year of grace, filled with opportunities to deepen our relationship with Christ. The season of Advent is described as a time of preparation and joyful expectation. As the Gospel for today reminds us, we are to **stay awake** and **be prepared**, **for at an hour you do not expect**, **the Son of Man will come**. Advent calls us to prepare ourselves to celebrate the birth of Christ once again, but to also be prepared for his glorious return in the future. This time of preparation is best lived out by immersing ourselves in prayer, being attentive to the ways Christ is revealed to us in our daily lives, and finding ways to serve the needs of others. All of us are especially encouraged to celebrate the **Sacrament of Reconciliation** during Advent. Our parish communal Reconciliation service will be held **Monday**, **December 12**, **at 6:30 p.m.** There will be several priests present to hear confessions. The dates and times for the services at other area parishes are also listed in the bulletin.

Our **Advent Reflection Evening** with *Immaculee* is coming up on Wednesday, December 7, beginning at 6:30 p.m. This event requires a ticket. All the available tickets (650) have been given out. If you received a ticket and no longer are able to attend that night, please be sure to return your ticket to the Parish Office so we can make it available to others. We are looking forward to a powerful, faith-filled evening.

Thanks to everyone who returned their **Stewardship Commitment forms**. If you have not had a chance to do so, please take time to complete the forms and return to the Parish Office or in the collection basket at Mass within the next couple of weeks. We appreciate your commitment to stewardship. We are also grateful for those who participated in our Stewardship Renewal service activity and purchased coats in support of our service partner, Bishop Sullivan Center.

Bishop Johnston recently gave permission to parishes in our diocese to once again offer the **Precious Blood of Christ** to the faithful at Communion beginning the First Sunday of Advent. Starting this weekend, you are welcome to receive from the Cup. Please be mindful of your own health condition and the health of others before making this choice.





Report Abuse
