

CALL OUT RACIST STATEMENTS

When you hear racist statements or "jokes," let people know it's not okay. You don't have to be confrontational - ask questions, and engage in conversation.



SEE EACH PERSON AS A REFLECTION OF GOD

All humans are made in the image and likeness of God. What do the details and qualities of individuals teach us about God?



PRACTICE EMPATHY

Think about the feelings and experiences of others. Share your experiences and invite them to share with you. When we create connections with others, it motivates us to care about their well-being.



PRAY FOR JUSTICE

Pray for an open heart for yourself and others.

Pray for the courage to choose love over fear,
healing over hurt.





Thoughts from Fr. Tom

In the Gospel today, Jesus refers to his disciples in two important ways: You are the salt of the earth and you are the light of the world. Salt enhances the flavor of the food it touches and light is necessary to help us see our way, especially through the darkness. What wonderful images for those who follow Christ. We are to enhance the lives of those we serve and we are called to be the light of Christ for others. When we refer to someone as being a salt of the earth person, we usually mean that the person is filled with goodness and grounded in what is important. When we use the image of light to describe someone, it is usually a positive reference to the way that person makes a difference in the lives of others. As we continue our theme of Just Disciple this year, those are great images to keep before us as we strive to be disciples of Jesus by sharing his light and goodness with others.

This weekend we will offer the **Blessing of Throats** after all the Masses in honor of the Feast of St. Blaise. His actual Feast day was on Friday. As we ask for his intercession, we also trust in the healing God brings to our lives.

This time of year we are especially blessed by the presence of many children, youth, and adults who are preparing to receive important Sacraments of Initiation in our Catholic faith. We have about 120 children preparing for their First Eucharist in April and May. In the coming weeks, they will be gathering with their parents for retreats and learning experiences. We have about 60 teens preparing for the Sacrament of Confirmation in April. They are currently gathering for their formation sessions and will have a retreat next month. We also have about 20 individuals participating in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults and preparing to be received into the Catholic faith at Easter. They have begun gathering on Sunday for their formation classes. On February 25 they will celebrate the Rite of Sending in the parish and then go to the Cathedral to join with hundreds of others from around our diocese to celebrate the Rite of Election. Please keep in your prayers all of those involved in sacramental preparation in our parish. They are a wonderful witness for all of us and a constant reminder of God's presence in the sacraments.

Next weekend we observe **World Marriage Sunday** in the Catholic Church. In connection with this, we will once again offer a special blessing and **renewal of marriage vows** for all married couples after the 4:30 p.m. Mass next Saturday, February 11. We invite you to stay after Mass and move to the front of church after the Closing song. This only takes a few minutes, but is a great way for married couples to strengthen their commitment to the sacrament of marriage. We will also offer a blessing of married couples at the Sunday Masses.
