Thoughts from Fr. Tom

In the Gospel this weekend, Jesus opens the eyes of a man born blind. The story begins with the disciples asking Jesus: Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind? Jesus quickly dispels this commonly held belief of his time by saying that neither sinned. The mercy of God that Jesus shares turns everything upside down and allows those who experience it to see everything differently. Jesus goes further by saying that the works of God will be made visible through the healing of the blind man and help reveal Jesus as the light of the world. This powerful story is an invitation for all of us to see with the eyes of faith. Most of us will never have to deal with physical blindness. We often take our physical sight for granted, but spiritual blindness is something that affects all of us at times. This season of Lent is a time for our eyes to be opened so that we may recognize the presence of Jesus in our midst.

This **Sunday**, **March 19**, marks another important day in our Church – the **Feast of St. Joseph**. Although his feast day does not take precedence over the Sunday in Lent, it is still a time to celebrate Joseph as the earthly father of Jesus and the righteous man who upheld the dignity of Mary in a difficult situation. As protector and provider for the Holy Family, Joseph is a model of humility and faith. St. Joseph is the patron of the Universal Church, workers, and fathers. Let us call upon the intercession of St. Joseph to help us build up God's kingdom through the work of our hands.

Our parish is honoring St. Joseph this Sunday with our **St. Joseph Table** and pasta meal. The table blessing will be at 11:00 a.m. and the meal will be served form 11:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. In keeping with tradition, all proceeds from the event will go to help those in need. Please plan to join us.

This Monday, March 20, we will gather for our Lenten Reconciliation Service at 6:30 p.m. in the church. All of us are encouraged to take advantage of this sacrament of forgiveness as we prepare ourselves for the joy of Christ's Resurrection. There will be several priests here to assist with individual confessions.

In the sacrament of Reconciliation God humbly confesses his love for us and we humbly confess our need for that love and the confidence it brings. We confess our desire to be at home in the sanctuary of pure love. When we are aware of God's love we cannot help but share that love. God's love is so powerful and immense that we cannot keep it to ourselves. Our awareness of God's love will naturally transform our lives. It will naturally affect all our relationships. This is why we celebrate the sacrament of Reconciliation in the community.


