Remember our parish listening session for the Synod on Synodality in March 2022?

The Synod's diocesan, national, and continental stages are complete, and a committee is creating a document synthesizing all the feedback.

Five Common Points of the Synod so far:

Listening: Listening is an openness to begin with a desire for radical inclusion — no one excluded! — to be understood in a perspective of communion with our sisters and brothers and with our common Father. In this sense, listening is already missional and a proclamation.

Mission: This is a mission that Catholics recognize must be carried out in the company of their brothers and sisters and in dialogue with believers of other religions, transforming human actions of care into authentically spiritual experiences that proclaim the face of a God who loves to the point of giving his own life so that we may have it in abundance.

Participation: the taking on of a style based on the participation — which also means a shared responsibility — of all the baptized, stemming from our common baptismal dignity, in the commitment to carry out the Church's one mission.

Possibilities: the construction of concrete possibilities for living communion, participation and mission through structures and institutions inhabited by people adequately formed and sustained by a vibrant spirituality.

Liturgy: the liturgy, in particular the Eucharistic liturgy, is the source and summit of the Christian life, which brings the community together, making communion tangible, allows the exercise of participation, and nourishes with the Word and the Sacraments the impetus towards mission.





Warm greetings. I hope you are in good health and that God is blessing your lives.

Well, first of all, I'd like to thank God for allowing me to write to you and have the opportunity to tell you about all the things we've been doing. I want to thank you for the unconditional support that you give not only to me, but also to more students from high school and university. Thank you for the support t that you give us so that each one of us can improve our lives and become good professionals.

I wanted to tell you than I am studying to be a nurse at the university. I love this branch of medicine, as I like to deal with older patients and children. When I take my patient's blood pressure, they are easy to work with and they have conversations with me. Some clinical rotations I've had to do are from 7am to 5pm, lasting two weeks. It's a nice experience because we need to learn more about the healthcare field.

Report Abuse
