


Groups begin in early October and end before Thanksgiving. We will also have groups during Lent.

Thoughts from Fr. Tom

In the Gospel today, Jesus shares a parable that many people have a hard time swallowing. In our modern world, we value fairness and equality. But even in Jesus' time, those hearing this parable would have thought it unfair that the laborers who only worked one hour at the end of the day would get paid the same wage as those who worked all day and bore the day's burden and the heat. By comparing God to the landowner in this parable, Jesus is reminding us of the generosity of God. The landowner did not cheat those who worked all day because he paid them the agreed upon wage. He was only being generous to those who were hired at the end of the day. They have the same needs as all the others and in God's world they should not be deprived of what they need so that others can have more. In the end, we should all be grateful that we are recipients of God's generosity.

This coming Thursday, September 28, is our "Encounter Joy" Parish Evening of Reflection at 6:30 p.m. in the church. We will focus on our parish-wide theme for the year and reflect on ways we can encounter joy through our relationship with Jesus so that we can be sources of joy in our encounters with others. 

Report Abuse
