# **Epiphany Blessing of the Home**

This year we celebrate Epiphany on January 7. On the feast of the Epiphany, it is traditional to bless homes, including passageways and doorways.

Often related to these blessings is a ritual of "chalking" the doors of the home with the numbers of the year separated by the initials, CMB. The letters traditionally refer to the legendary names of the three kings: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar. Another tradition refers to it as the abbreviation of the Latin phrase, *Christus mansionem benedicat*, translated as "May Christ bless this house."

To bless your home, use chalk and mark 20+C+M+B+24 on the lintel of your door saying: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar followed the star of God's Son who became human 2024 years ago. May Christ bless our home and remain with us throughout the new year. Amen.

# Thoughts from Fr. Tom

Blessings of the New Year! As we finish this first week of 2024, we continue our celebration of the Christmas season with the Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord. This feast has been described as the brightness of Christmas shining on us as Jesus is revealed to all nations. The familiar scripture story of the star in the night leading the magi to a simple stable reminds us of the power of God at work in the most common of places. The magi represent people of all nations, including foreigners and strangers, and as we hear in the story: the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. May this new year of 2024 bring many opportunities to be overjoyed at seeing Christ, the true Light, shining brightly in our lives as we seek to share the treasure of our faith each day.

The Feast of the Epiphany is the traditional time for the blessing of homes. The home is where much of the activity of our lives happens, so it seems fitting to bless the doorway of our home to remind us of Christ's presence as we come and go. The simple blessing for your home can be found in the bulletin. If you have blessed chalk from past years, you may use it again. There is additional blessed chalk in the Gathering Space. The marking you make with the chalk is the first initial for each of the traditional names of the three magi or wise men – Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar – and the numbers for the year. This year you would mark the upper lintel of the main door you use with 20 + C + M + B + 24. This is a great conversation piece among family and friends and a daily reminder that God is with us on our journey.

The Christmas season comes to a close with the **Feast of the Baptism of the Lord**, this Monday, January 8. As we celebrate Jesus' baptism in the Jordan, we are also reminded that we have been baptized in Christ and are called to be his presence in the world. We keep the wonder and power of Christmas alive by living out our baptismal call.

Have you made any resolutions for the new year? The new year marks a new beginning and so is filled with hope and excitement as we focus on new possibilities for the coming year. And this should include resolutions concerning our


