Thoughts from Fr. Tom

This weekend we enter a stretch of Ordinary Time that falls between the Christmas season and the beginning of Lent. A resource I read recently put it this way: After the lights and caros of Christmas, Ordinary Time - which actually means counted time (we number the weeks) - can seem so, well, ordinary. But it is in the ordinary days of our ordinary lives that God asks us to build his Kingdom. This weekend we hear about the importance of being called. First, Samuel is called by the Lord and answers readily with: *Here I am. You called me*. In the Gospel, John the Baptist identifies Jesus as the Lamb of God and immediately two of John's disciples begin to follow Jesus. Andrew, one of the two, finds his own brother Simon Peter and tells him: We have found the Messiah. The call of God comes in different ways, sometimes dramatic and sometimes in the ordinary events of our day to day experiences. Regardless of how we are called, it should lead us to respond with our lives and share the good news of Jesus with others.

The season of "Winter" Ordinary Time is short this year with Lent only a month away. But as we begin a new year, there are also new opportunities to grow in our faith. In the next couple of weeks, you can join a **3-session scripture study** of John's Gospel and take part in discussion groups for the Matthew Kelly book we handed out at Christmas – *The Rocking Chair Prophet*. I encourage you to participate. And mark your calendars now for our **3-evening Lenten Mission** – February 26, 27, and 28. See the bulletin for more details.


This is an **exciting time of year** as many of our children and teens are preparing to receive Sacraments and those adults in the RCIA are entering a more committed time in preparation for joining the Catholic faith at Easter. We have over 100 children preparing for their First Eucharist. We have over 70 high school youth preparing for the Sacrament of Confirmation. And we have about 20 adults and their children preparing to be received in the Church at Easter. Those preparing to receive these sacraments are wonderful signs of God's presence. Please keep all of them in your prayers.

This week there are several observances that need our prayer and attention. This Monday, January 15, is the national observance of **Martin Luther King**, **Jr**. Let us continue praying for an end to the racial hatred and division in our nation. January 18 -25 is the **Week of Prayer for Christian Unity**. Say a prayer that the division between Christians can be healed. Next Monday, January 22, is the anniversary of the Roe v. Wade decision. With the overturning of that decision, this is now marked as a day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for the violations to the dignity of the human person. Our prayers make a difference.



BeFrienders experience this often. Whether it's an official BeFriender visit or a friend or family member, we are equipped to know when to keep quiet and when to speak; how to realize that the person I am with needs to talk, when to put on my BeFriender hat and say, "Tell me more." BeFrienders are trained volunteer ministers who provide a caring, listening presence to people in difficult and transitional situations, such as illness, loneliness, or loss of a loved one.


