Thoughts from Fr. Tom

Every year on this First Sunday of Lent we hear the story of Jesus' temptation in the desert. Mark's Gospel does not contain many details of this event but simply states that the Spirit drove Jesus out into the desert, and he remained in the desert for forty days, tempted by Satan. The point Mark is trying to make is that Jesus has his own desert experience like his ancestors, confronts temptation, and returns victorious. Jesus is now ready to begin his public ministry as he proclaims: This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel. The season of Lent provides all of us an opportunity each year to have our own desert experience so we can continue the work of proclaiming the good news of Jesus. With Christ, we have the power to confront our temptations and emerge victorious on our journey of faith. Blessings on your Lenten journey!

One of the great ways to enter into the spirit of Lent is through the disciplines of **prayer**, **fasting**, **and almsgiving**. These disciplines help us simplify our lives and focus on our relationship with God. Here are some ways you can live out these disciplines:

Join us for **PRAYER** throughout Lent. In addition to weekend Mass, we also have **daily Mass** at 8:15 a.m. Monday through Friday and during Lent we add a **6:30 a.m. Mass on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday**. Attending daily Mass is a great way to strengthen your faith during Lent. We also pray the **Stations of the Cross** every Friday of Lent at 6:30 p.m. Making Stations a weekly commitment is an opportunity to enter into the Passion of Christ. Everyone is encouraged to attend our 3-evening **Lenten PARISH MISSION** at 6:30 p.m. **February 26-28**. We are privileged to have international speaker *Fr. Ricky Manalo* lead the Mission. And as we ready our hearts for the celebration of Easter, we will have our **Parish Reconciliation Service** on March 18. Check the bulletin for all the details.

Make **FASTING** a daily commitment during Lent by not only "giving up things" but by "doing things" that will draw us closer to God. Fasting can take the form of refraining from behaviors that get in the way of our relationship with God – like fasting from gossip, judging others, or other sinful patterns. Let's all reflect on the fasting that will lead us closer to God.

The discipline of **ALMSGIVING** helps focus us on the needs of others. One of our Lenten almsgiving projects is our **Blessing Boxes** to support our sister community in El Salvador. You can learn about our sister community in the weekly bulletin reflections and then make a contribution at the end of Lent. You can also help people locally through our regular food and collection drives for our service partners. We can all do a little extra during Lent to share our blessings with others and make a difference.

We also celebrate community every Friday during Lent with our famous **Fish Fry**!







News From El Salvador




Presentation parishioner, Richard Sinning, traveled to El Salvador as an Election Observer for their recent Presidential election.

CIS is one of the few entities that has organized volunteer observers from abroad in an election observation mission for every presidential and legislative election in El Salvador since the return of democracy with the signing of the Peace Accords in 1992. El Salvador's Supreme Electoral Tribunal, Salvadoran communities, and local civic and grassroots organizations have continued to ask CIS to organize observation missions.

The CIS International Election Observer Missions have earned a reputation of respect both in El Salvador and abroad for their professional organization and commitment to a free and fair democratic election process.

The findings and recommendations for the CIS's election observation reports have served to spotlight strengths and weaknesses in the electoral process. They have been used regularly as a basis for electoral reform proposals presented by members of the Legislative Assembly, the Supreme Electoral Tribunal, and other electoral insti-

Look for the labels on canned goods, baking products, spices, dairy, etc. We save the UPCs and when we reach 1,000 labels we can be reimbursed \$30. The cut-out part must include the words Best Choice or Clearly AND the UPC code. Place your Best Choice UPCs in the specially marked envelope located at the south end of the gathering space. Be it one or several, we will be happy to have them all. Thank you for your help.
