Carlo Acutis and Pier Giorgio Frassati

BOTH MEN WILL BE CANONIZED BY POPE LEO XIV ON SEPTEMBER 7

Carlo Acutis was born on May 3, 1991, in London to Italian parents, then moved with his family shortly afterward to Milan, Italy.

From a very young age, he displayed a deep devotion to the Eucharist, often attending Mass daily and calling it his "highway to heaven."

A gifted programmer, Carlo built websites for his parish and projects, notably creating one that catalogued Eucharistic miracles worldwide. It can be viewed at www.miracolieucaristici.org/

He cared for the marginalized, supporting classmates through tough times and uplifting bullied students, especially those with disabilities.

Carlo earned the nickname "God's Influencer" for how he used technology to spread faith and positivity.

Diagnosed with leukemia in October 2006, Carlo considered his illness a gift to offer "for the Pope and the Church." He died on October 12, 2006, at age 15.

The Church declared him Blessed on October 10, 2020, after officially recognizing a miracle attributed to his intercession. Two miracles—one involving a miraculous recovery of a Brazilian child, another involving the healing of a Costa Rican woman after praying at his tomb—led to Pope Francis approving his canonization.

Carlo is set to be canonized as a saint on September 7, 2025, becoming the first saint born after 1926 and the first millennial saint. His feast day is October 12.

Carlo's body lies in a glass tomb at Santa Maria Maggiore in Assisi, where pilgrims—and even online visitors—can venerate his relics. Pier Giorgio Frassati was born on April 6, 1901, in Turin, Italy; his mother was a painter, and his father was the influential founder and director of the newspaper *La Stampa* and a political figure.

Pope John Paul II affectionately dubbed him the "Man of the Beatitudes" due to his lived devotion to the values of the Sermon on the Mount.

From childhood, he joined Marian Sodality and the Apostleship of Prayer, gaining rare permission, at the time, to receive daily Communion.

Known among friends as "Il Terrore" ("The Terror") for his fondness for harmless practical jokes.

He joined the Society of St. Vincent de Paul at age 17, dedicating himself to helping the poor, homeless, sick, and soldiers returning from WWI.

He famously said: "Charity is not enough; we need social reform." He helped found the newspaper Momento, inspired by Pope Leo XIII's social teaching in Rerum Novarum.

On May 28, 1922, Frassati joined the Third Order of Saint Dominic, taking the name "Girolamo" in honor of Savonarola. He was deeply influenced by Dominican spirituality.

An avid mountaineer and athlete, he climbed peaks such as Grand Tournalin and Monte Viso.

He died of polio on July 4, 1925, at age 24. His funeral drew thousands, and his remains were found incorrupt when transferred to the Turin Cathedral in 1981. His feast day is July 4.

Beatified by Pope John Paul II on May 20, 1990. His body has been carried to World Youth Day events (Sydney 2008, Kraków 2016). He is slated for canonization on September 7, 2025.



Thoughts from Fr. Tom

Jesus speaks about the cost of discipleship in today's Gospel. He reminds the *great crowds* who are following him that the path will not be easy. What are we to make of these words from Jesus that seem harsh and direct? Jesus is clear that he is not looking to be a popular attraction who people can follow casually. To follow the way of Jesus, one must be willing to give up relationships, possessions, and life itself. There is a depth of commitment required of those who choose to follow. We are called to turn away from our former ways and invest ourselves fully in the new life Christ promises us. With the parables Jesus uses in the Gospel, he encourages those who wish to follow him to calculate the cost and reflect on whether they are up for the challenge. But while the road may be demanding, the journey leads to eternal life with Christ.

Thank you for your outpouring of support for our recent **Red Bag Food Drive** for our service partner, Bishop Sullivan Center and the **Baby Bottle Campaign** sponsored by our Ladies Auxiliary of the Knights of Columbus to assist life causes in our area. Your generosity goes a long way in helping those in need. The parish service projects we have throughout the year are a way for us to put our faith into action and make a difference in the lives of others. We are grateful for your on-going response.

The annual **Parish Fiesta** is being held next **Saturday**, **September 13**. Hispanic members of our community prepare a variety of delicious food from different countries and provide some fun entertainment for everyone to enjoy. This event gets bigger every year, so you won't want to miss it. We are grateful for all the ways our Hispanic members share their culture and contribute to the life of our parish. If you haven't already done so, get your tickets after Mass this weekend.

If you have children needing to receive the **Sacraments of First Reconciliation/First Communion or the Sacrament of Confirmation**, the formation classes and parent information sessions begin soon. Please make sure they are registered to receive these sacraments. There is information and QR codes in the bulletin or you can call our Children's Faith Formation office or our Youth Ministry office. Those with middle school or high school aged youth are also encouraged to make sure they are signed up for our Youth Ministry programs. We have been building up our youth offerings and have a variety of ways they can grow in their faith and share in some fun and fellowship.

This Sunday is the **official canonization** of Blessed Carlo Acutis and Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati in Rome. If you haven't had a chance to learn about these new saints in our Church, I encourage you to do so. In their short lives, they lived powerful stories of faith. You can find information in our bulletin and on our website.



Como discípulos de Jesús, debemos seguirlo con lealtad inquebrantable, por encima de las lealtades

familiares y materiales, incluyendo a las personas que fácilmente pueden obstaculizar nuestro amor por Dios.

Es costoso hacerlo, pero podemos porque Dios nos ha enseñado que no hay imposibles para quienes piden su gracia. Requiere un compromiso personal para odiar o rechazar la tentación. Durante la semana, identifiquemos a las personas y cosas que obstaculizan nuestro crecimiento para convertirnos en los discípulos más eficaces de Jesús. Renunciemos a ellas y elijamos a Dios por encima de todo. Es gratificante elegir solo a Dios y su voluntad para nuestra vida eterna.
