

New update to medications from Health Room:

The OLP Health Room will be offering 'STOCK MEDS" this year for all students who fill out a 2025-2026 Medication Consent Form.

We will offer Tylenol, Advil, and Honey Bees brand cough drops. We will have oral pills to swallow, chewable, liquid and dye free options available.

If your child needs medications administered at school other than Nsaids or cough drops, a medication consent is necessary. For controlled substances, a doctor's note is needed, and for all inhalers and EpiPen's an action plan needs to be filled out and given to Health Room. We will have all necessary paperwork in Health Room on back to school night. Please feel free to drop off meds, get necessary paperwork or just come by to say hello.


WHEN THE LIGHT FINDS US
