
## Fr. Mike's Musings

#### Greetings, St Paul-Owosso Families!

Your children have been busy with Art and Computers over the past month. Kindergarten and First Grade have worked on a Pablo Picasso 'artist-appreciation' assignment based on his 'Flowers' painting, as well as a 'texture' project in Art, while Second and Third grade have been busy with projects dealing with contour lines and story-art based on the 'Peter, Peter Pumpkin Eater' nursery rhyme. Fourth and Fifth Grade have worked on art projects dealing with the use of the horizon line, an artist-appreciation assignment focused on Henri Matisse and the use of 'hot' and 'cold colors.' All grades have also worked on holiday-themed artwork, including efforts centered on Halloween and All Saints' Day, and, most recently, 'thank-you' notes to veterans, which I'll be mailing to a VFW post in time for Veterans' Day. Concepts embedded in your children's art assignments include lines, cross-hatching, coutours, the color wheel, 'hot' and 'cold' colors, the horizon line and artist appreciation.

Computer classes have focused on basic skills such as internet safety, safe and unsafe online practices, the 'home keys' and drills focusing on the proper hand placement for rapid, accurate 'touch typing.' As we move forward, Grades Two through Five, as they demonstrate keyboarding proficiency, will shift focus to lessons on using Google docs - formatting, capitalization, line spacing, changing font size, style and the use of the bold/italic/underline functions.

Thank you for sharing your children with me. They are a blessing and I appreciate the opportunity to be part of the St. Paul teaching ministry.
