<u>Scotland-Windthorst Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW)</u>
<u>Post 2676 and its Auxiliary</u> announces the kick-off of this year's VFW "Voice of Democracy and Patriot's Pen Scholarship Competitions". This year will also include the Citizenship Teacher of the Year award competition.

In the Voice of Democracy, high school students must write and record a 3 to 5-minute essay on the theme using an audio CD or flash drive and present their recording, typed essay and completed entry form to Scotland-Windthorst VFW Post 2676. The 2021-22 theme is "America: Where do we go from here?" The Post winners will earn scholarship money of \$300 for 1st Place; \$150 for 2nd and \$75 for 3nd. The Post winner then competes at the District level with the winner advancing to the state competition.

The Patriot's Pen essay competition is for students in grades 6-8. This competition challenges students to write a 300 to 400-word essay on a patriotic theme. The theme for 2021-22 is **"How Can I Be A Good American?"** Students begin at the local Post level where they can earn scholarship money of \$150 for 1st Place, \$75 for 2nd and \$50 for 3rd. The Post winner advances to District competition with the winner advancing to the state competition.

The Citizenship Teacher of the Year award recognizes elementary, junior high and high school teachers who teach citizenship education topics regularly and promote America's history/ traditions effectively. Post 2676 will select one teacher in each category who will be awarded \$100 each. Official entry forms are due to Post 2676 by midnight October 31, 2021. Eligibility requirements/official entry forms can be obtained from your school counselors or principals or by emailing the Post 2676 Program Chairman, David Teichman, at dateichman@gmail.com or by phone at 940-636-1566. This year marks the 200th anniversary of the birth of Andrew Kim Tae-gŏn, the first native-born Korean priest and patron saint of Korea. He was one of an estimated 10,000 who were martyred for their Christian faith in Korea in the 19th century. The theme of the bicentenary celebration is "Are you Catholic?" because Andrew's "yes" to that question during interrogation cost him his life. The bishop of the Korean city of Daejeon said the theme "calls us to reflect seriously on our identity and our consistency as Catholics." Take this opportunity to consider what your Catholic identity means to you.

The United Nations designates today as the International Day of Peace. It's also the feast of Saint Matthew—the evangelist whose list of Beatitudes includes the words "blessed are the peacemakers." According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, the "Beatitudes are at the heart of Jesus' preaching." They "shed light on the actions and attitudes characteristic of the Christian life" and are the "paradoxical promises that sustain hope in the midst of tribulations." Matthew must have experienced such tribulations when he, as a hated tax collector, joined the other apostles. Be a peacemaker today, especially among people you're nearest to.

TODAY'S READINGS: Ephesians 4:1-7, 11-13; Matthew 9:9-13 (643). "I desire mercy, not sacrifice."

Share the wealth

Power sharing and collaborative ministry are thorny questions within church circles and many faith communities. Jesus can be our model and our guide, in this as in all questions. When he sent the apostles out he did so in pairs and "gave them power and authority." Add it up and it equals shared, collaborative ministry. Those who are sure of their own authority are able to share it freely and without fear. More ministries and leadership positions

will open up in the church when those with power learn to trust the faith community the way Jesus did.

In a secular world that prizes material possessions, the mystical aspect of the church can captivate. Saint Padre Pio (1887-1968) certainly drew attention for his mystical attributes. A relatively obscure Italian Capuchin priest, he gained fame for reportedly displaying the wounds of Christ, called stigmata, and for his insightful (some called it psychic) abilities as a confessor. He spent up to 10 hours a day with people who sought guidance and forgiveness in Confession. Only a few of us become mystics, but all can seek holiness and insight. Today meditate and act on the path to holiness that God has placed before you.

TODAY'S READINGS: Haggai 1:1-8; Luke 9:7-9 (452). "Herod said, 'John I beheaded. Who then is this about whom I hear such things?"

Grounded in a sense of belonging

In our Western mindset, we often think of land as "property," owned and available for human use. But if we hope to stem climate change, we need to realize it's really the other way around. The land doesn't belong to us; we belong to the land. Writes Pope Francis in his encyclical on caring for creation, *Laudato Si':* "Many things have to change course, but it is we human beings above all who need to change. We lack an awareness of our common origin, of our mutual belonging, and of a future to be shared with everyone." How will you commit to the care of this land that sustains us in so many ways?

What and How to Pray

In the Gospel of Luke one of the disciples said to Jesus, "Lord, teach us to pray" (Luke 11:1b, New American Bible) and in the Sermon on the Mount Jesus said "This is how you are to pray." (Matthew 6:9a, NAB). In this prayer Jesus gave us what many have seen to be **7Ps** of prayer.

Many people experience difficulty with prayer. This has always been the case but is even more so in our world with our lifestyles characterized by busyness, noise, speed and social media. These are obstacles and distractions to our prayer life. Clearly the disciples of Jesus day also had difficulty in knowing what and how to pray, when they asked Him, "Lord, teach us to pray." (Mt 6:9a). Jesus gives them and us what we call "the Lord's Prayer," the "Our Father." I recently came across a DVD video interview of a biblical scholar who encouraged those beginning to pray to start by doing these three things. Firstly to praise God, secondly, to petition God for their needs and thirdly, to ask pardon for their sins. She called these, 3 Ps of prayer and she based these on petition verses in the Lord's prayer. I then recalled that many others have seen up to 6 and even 7Ps of prayer in the Lord's prayer. These Ps of prayer are prayers of Presence, Praise, Purpose, Petition, Pardon, Protection and Persistence. These are attitudes and concerns we all should bring to any prayer. In fact, these are also a list of categories of prayer, any or all of which could be present anytime we pray. So, in this Jesus is not just giving us one prayer — the Lord's Prayer — he's also giving us the framework to guide us in all of our prayer life, regardless of whatever words we use. So here let us do a brief summery review of the categories of prayer petitions sourced from the Lord's prayer:

"Our Father who art in Heaven": **Presence**. When we pray we should always begin by consciously placing ourselves in God's presence, in the presence of Our Father, to whom we are addressing our prayer.

"Hallowed be thy Name": **Praise**. Second we should always begin by praising Him (and thanking Him), for who He is, recalling that He is Our Gracious Loving Father and we are His children."

"Thy Kingdom come, thy will be done": **Purpose**. We commit ourselves to building His kingdom, not our own. To doing His will, not our own.

"Give us this day our daily bread": **Petition**. We proceed to ask Him to provide us with all that we need. Nowhere does God promise to satisfy all our desires because that might not serve His loving purposes for us. But God does promise to provide our most basic needs if we ask Him. Confidently we ask Him for our daily bread (earthly and Heavenly) for our physical and spiritual needs.

"Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us": **Pardon**. We always need to ask for pardon and ask for the grace and strength to pardon others (Proverbs 24:16). But we dare ask for pardon only to the degree that we are willing to extend it to others.

"Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil" **Protection**. Finally we ask and trust our Heavenly Father in advance for His protection from dangers from within —temptations and from evils from outside of us, including disasters of every sort.

Jesus immediately follows this teaching on prayer in Luke's version with the Parable of the Persistent Friend (Lk 11:5-8). Here, is where we find the **7**th**P**, the necessity to always persist in prayer. **Persistence.**

In summery: We should place our self in God's presence, praise Him, commit to doing His will, petition Him regarding our needs, pardon others and seek His protection and persist in our prayers. So remember these **7 Ps** of prayer which will help you in your prayer life. **PS** All of these categories of prayer are found also in the Holy Mass.
