





Scotland-Windthorst Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW)
Post 2676 and its Auxiliary announces the kick-off of this year's VFW "Voice of Democracy and Patriot's Pen Scholarship Competitions". This year will also include the Citizenship Teacher of the Year award competition.

In the Voice of Democracy, high school students must write and record a 3 to 5-minute essay on the theme using an audio CD or flash drive and present their recording, typed essay and completed entry form to Scotland-Windthorst VFW Post 2676. The 2021-22 theme is "America: Where do we go from here?" The Post winners will earn scholarship money of \$300 for 1st Place; \$150 for 2nd and \$75 for 3rd. The Post winner then competes at the District level with the winner advancing to the state competition.

The Patriot's Pen essay competition is for students in grades 6-8. This competition challenges students to write a 300 to 400-word essay on a patriotic theme. The theme for 2021-22 is **"How Can I Be A Good American?"** Students begin at the local Post level where they can earn scholarship money of \$150 for 1st Place, \$75 for 2nd and \$50 for 3rd. The Post winner advances to District competition with the winner advancing to the state competition.

The Citizenship Teacher of the Year award recognizes elementary, junior high and high school teachers who teach citizenship education topics regularly and promote America's history/ traditions effectively. Post 2676 will select one teacher in each category who will be awarded \$100 each. Official entry forms are due to Post 2676 by midnight October 31, 2021. Eligibility requirements/official entry forms can be obtained from your school counselors or principals or by emailing the Post 2676 Program Chairman, David Teichman, at dateichman@gmail.com or by phone at 940-636-1566. Call or email the Program Chairman to obtain information on the submission of your completed entries.

Saint Denis, a third-century bishop of Paris, is invoked for the relief of migraine headaches, possibly because he is a *cephalophore*, a Greek term that means "head-carrier." He was martyred by decapitation and was said to have picked up the severed head and trotted off with it under his arm while preaching on repentance. Wild though that sounds, artists depicting the saint over the centuries struggled with the question, "Where do you put the halo? Over his head, or where his head used to be?" Though we smile, a nugget of truth comes through the legend. When we give all we have to God, our life is memorable and our story ends well.




