Scotland-Windthorst Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW)

Post 2676 and its Auxiliary announces the kick-off of this year's VFW "Voice of Democracy and Patriot's Pen Scholarship Competitions". This year will also include the Citizenship Teacher of the Year award competition. In the Voice of Democracy, high school students must write and record a 3 to 5-minute essay on the theme using a flash drive, or other electronic device and present their recording, typed essay and completed entry form to Scotland-Windthorst VFW Post 2676. The 2023-24 theme is **"What are the greatest attributes of our Democracy?"** The Post winners will earn scholarship money of \$300 for 1st Place; \$150 for 2d and \$75 for 3rd. The Patriot's Pen essay competition is for students in grades 6-8. This competition challenges students to write a 300 to 400-word essay on a patriotic theme. The theme for 2023-24 is **"How are you inspired by America?"** Students begin at the local Post level where they can earn scholarship money of \$150 for 1st Place, \$75 for 2d and \$50 for 3rd.

The **Citizenship Teacher of the Year** award recognizes **elementary, junior high and high school** teachers who teach citizenship education topics regularly and promote America's history/ traditions effectively. Post 2676 will select one teacher in each category who will be awarded \$100 each. All VFW Post 2676 VOD, PP and Teacher of the Year winners will compete at the District 8 level with the possibility of advancing to the state and national competitions. Official entry forms are due to Post 2676 by midnight October 31, 2023. Eligibility requirements/official entry forms can be obtained from your school counselors or principals or by emailing the Post 2676 Program Chairman, David Teichman, at dateichman@gmail.com or by phone at 940-636-1566. **Call or email the Program Chairman to obtain information on the submission of your completed entries.**

How have you been blessed by God, and how can you share that with others?

Christianity, by the book

As early Christianity distanced itself from Judaism, Christians began to lose touch with their faith's deep Jewish roots. Saint Jerome (born around 340) helped to reestablish the link. He learned Hebrew from a Christian monk who had converted from Judaism. More unusual for the time, he studied with Jewish rabbis to gain a better understanding of Hebrew scripture. He then spent 15 years producing the foundational Latin translation of the Hebrew Bible, which we know as the Old Testament. He later said, "For if, as Paul says, Christ is the power of God and the wisdom of God, and if the man who does not know Scripture does not know the power and wisdom of God, then ignorance of Scriptures is ignorance of Christ." Crack open the Good Book today, in honor of a key figure who helped shape it.
