EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

WORKING IN ST. VINCENT'S VINEYARD

It's an age-old phenomenon: your father lives 2,000 miles away but is suffering from mental illness and needs someone to help. You're the only one, so you decide you must pull up roots, quit your job, and move your wife and small child to Atlanta. You feel it in your bones: "I must do this and will sort out the challenges when they arise."

Unfortunately, in this case, his desire to help hits a wall upon arrival. The father's mental illness has worsened, and he's now violent. You quickly decide you must move out of his house to keep your family safe. Your only real option is to live in your truck.

He reached out to St. Vincent de Paul for help. Our Vincentian caught up with them when they'd been living in the truck for two weeks. They had started driving for a food delivery company to get some cash. Our Vincentian learned that the mother suffered from chronic depression and needed medication.

It gets cold in December, so keeping warm in the truck was an issue, too. With the homeless, the situation normally presents itself as two problems, one short-term and one longer term. In this case, since the truck was their 'home', it was decided we could best help in the short term to help with the monthly truck payment and insurance. They had enough to pay some of it, but not all. Plus, we helped them get a battery to run a heater at night.

The longer run is less clear for them. We referred them to Mercy Care to begin the process of getting the mother the medication she needs. They are applying for permanent jobs. They need daycare. All this takes time and is somewhat problematic due to the lack of a permanent address.

Thanks to the generosity of our IHM parish family, we were able to accomplish the short-term goal of keeping them safe and warm. We will monitor their progress for the longer-term issues and may need to step in once more. Only time will tell. Please keep them in your prayers.

THE ORIGINS OF THE SOCIETY & SERVICE TO THE POOR

St/ Vincent de Paul is much more than a patron saint of thrift shops! Young Vincent became a priest, hoping to advance and rise above his modest upbringing. His early ambition was little when he was assigned to a poor rural parish. Here, he experienced a new joy in his vocation.

Hearing the profound deathbed confession of a dying servant, Vincent became more convinced of the special attention that must be given to people experiencing poverty. In 1625, Vincent founded the Congregation of the Mission to care for the less fortunate. Originally priests only, the mission expanded to include groups of laity who provided for the spiritual and material needs of the poor in each parish. Nearly 400 hundred years later, his legacy lives on!
