October 1, 2023 Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time



The Lords way is not fair!

Those words from the people of Israel that Ezekiel wrote about in today's 1st Reading are echoed by the Gospel from Matthew. So which son are we from the parable? Do we say yes with our mouths and fail to act? Or do we complain that it's not fair and then think better of it?

Salvation is not for the perfect, but for the truly repentant. Redemption is still available for those who refuse the call of the Lord at first. These prostitutes and tax collectors to whom Jesus referred had *repented* of their sin and come back into union with the will of the Father. They acknowledged their status as sinners and resolved to sin no more. Thus, they had moved farther on the path of salvation. Now, one can imagine what the priests and elders thought of this parable. Jesus was explicitly saying that the priests and elders were the second son of the parable — the hypocrite who deliberately said one thing while doing another. They sought honor and power for themselves, not to serve the people. They no doubt felt entitled to God's favor, so hearing Jesus parable was a deep insult to their

dignity. We are called to worship and praise God. Being sinful, we will always suffer through the temptations of a fallen world, and may succumb to it on occasion. But even after those times when we balk at His will and petulantly refuse to obey His Word, we still have redemption and salvation open to us by renewing our commitment with Jesus Christ, and following His call for joyful toil in the vineyards for His harvest.
