

That's Not Fair!

Have you heard your child, teenager or even yourself say this! We place a high value on fairness. Jesus' statement may not fit the criteria many of us may attribute to our concept of fair play. However, Jesus challenges us to step beyond our culture's idea of fairness. The landowner in the parable was a generous man and he made the choice to pay each of his laborers a full day's wage, regardless of whether they worked 8 full hours or only 30 minutes. He was fair to the workers who had worked a full day; he paid them the amount of money that they had agreed upon.

As we know, these workers were jealous and they grumbled. Are we ever jealous or resentful when someone else receives a gift, acclaim, or praise for an act that we think they neither deserved nor earned? Jealousy and resentment may not affect the other person; however, it does affect us! It can eat away at us and make us miserable. When we compare ourselves to others, we typically may judge ourselves as above them or below them. Both judgments damage the other person as well as ourselves.

The general idea of the parable is that everyone comes to the vineyard (faith) at different points in their lives. Some people are lifelong disciples of Jesus, and some people convert only toward the end of their lives. In the kingdom of God, both groups are treated the same. By human standards, we perhaps might view this as unjust. Yet Jesus points out that the reward for their long work (heaven) is fair, and the only reason that others receive this same reward is because of the generosity of the owner of the vineyard (God). It is his (God's) to do with as he pleases. So long as we have not been treated unjustly, how could we reasonably complain that God is generous to others?

On the weekend of September 23-24, we will welcome Father Kenneth Nielson, who will speak to us about the "Food for the Poor" organization. Father Neilson is an incardinated priest of the Diocese of Austin who is retired and currently resides in Ann Arbor, Michigan. Founded in 1982, Food for the Poor (FFTP) is one of the largest international relief and development organizations in the nation and does much more than feed millions of hungry children and families living in poverty primarily in 17 countries of the Caribbean and Latin America. Thanks to its faithful donors, the organization's programs are providing housing, health care, education, clean water, emergency relief and micro-enterprise assistance, in addition to feeding hundreds of thousands of people each day. Since its founding, Food for the Poor has built 93,608 homes for the destitute. In 2022, the charity built 1,556 homes for families in need of safe shelter. --- Msgr. Skonseng
