# December 10, 2023 Second Sunday of Advent



Today's Gospel Reading focuses upon John the Baptist. This passage is the first eight verses of St. Mark's account of the Gospel. It's telling that St. Mark chose John the Baptist to be the first person he describes in his Gospel account.

The message of John the Baptist is founded upon humility. Everything about John speaks to humility: from the place where he dwells—a desert—to his clothing—camel's hair and a leather belt—to his diet of locusts and wild honey. But John's message is even humbler than his dwelling, clothing, and diet. His message demands that those listening make themselves humble.

John's message is a "baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins." St. Mark the Evangelist goes on to describe this further: how people "were going out to [John the Baptist] and were

being baptized by him in the Jordan River as they acknowledged their sins."

This act of humility—acknowledging one's sins—is the first step to accepting the gift of Jesus. Every year about this time, you hear the saying that Jesus is "the reason for the season". True enough. But what's the further reason? That is to ask: why was Jesus born in Bethlehem? Why did God the Father send His only Child from Heaven down to earth?

The chief reason is summed up in a little saying: "The wood of the crib is the wood of the cross." What God the Son, as God, could not accomplish from Heaven is to die in order to wash away both your sins, and the punishment that your sins merit. That's why if you won't acknowledge your sins as St. John the Baptist demands, you won't be able to accept Jesus as the gift that God the Father sent Him to be for you.

## The Communion Chant or Sung Communion Antiphon

During Sundays of Advent, we will be introducing the singing of the Communion antiphon. Regarding singing during Communion, The General Instruction of the Roman Missal states: "While the priest is receiving the Sacrament, the Communion Chant is begun, its purpose being to express the spiritual union of the communicants by means of the unity of their voices, to show gladness of heart, and to bring out more clearly the 'communitarian' character of the procession to receive the Eucharist. This singing is prolonged for as long as the Sacrament is being administered to the faithful" (#86). The Communion Chant is the Communion antiphon with its verses. The Communion antiphon is particularly made, we say proper, for each Sunday and Holy Day Mass of the liturgical year and for the time of the Communion during Mass and expresses the meaning and grace of the Holy Eucharist. The Communion antiphon is the repeated refrain of the Communion Chant. We may have the song leader or choir sing the antiphon and all the people repeat it. We may also have the song leader or choir sing the verses and all the people chant the antiphon. There is a Communion antiphon printed for every Mass in the missals. It may be recited by all the people, usually after the priest receives Holy Communion. --- Msgr. Skonseng

## Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe

We celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe on Tuesday, December 12th. This feast recalls the apparitions of Mary at the hill of Tepeyac from December 9-12, 1531, to the native convert, Saint Juan Diego. She was known to the Aztecs as Tecoatlaxope (or de Guadalupe in Spanish), meaning "she will crush the serpent of stone." She was declared patroness of the Americas by Pope Pius XII, and this day was raised to the rank of Feast for all the countries of the Americas by the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments, March 25, 1999. This information was taken from the Order of Prayer in the Liturgy of the Hours and Celebration of the Eucharist 2024.

**Note:** The Fourth Sunday of Advent, December 24th, and Christmas, December 25th, are both solemnities (holy days) of obligation. The obligation for each solemnity must be fulfilled with a separate Mass. The obligation for the Forth Sunday of Advent may be fulfilled at any Mass from the evening of Saturday, December 23rd, and throughout the entire day of Sunday, December 24th. The obligation for Christmas may be fulfilled from the evening (after 4:00 pm) of Sunday, December 24th, and throughout Monday, December 25th.

Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God

Sunday, December 31 5:00 PM St. Rose of Lima, Hillsboro

Monday, January 1 8:30 AM St. Rose of Lima, Hillsboro

Monday, January 1 10:30 AM St. William's, Argusville

**Note:** The solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God is not obligatory this year because it falls on a Monday, January 1st, a day after Sunday, December 31st, the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. The obligation for the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph may be fulfilled at any Mass from the evening of Saturday, December 30th, and throughout the entire day of Sunday, December 31st. Although it is not obligatory, you are encouraged for the spiritual benefits for you and others to participate in one of the Masses for Mary, the Mother of God on Sunday evening, December 31st, or Monday, January 1st.

#### Schedule for Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) during Advent

I will be available for the sacrament of Reconciliation before the 5:00 PM Mass at St. Rose of Lima Church from 4:00 to 4:50 PM on Saturdays in December. I will be available before the 8:30 AM Mass at St. William's Church from 7:30 to 8:20 AM on Sundays in December. On Sunday, December 10th, we will celebrate a Communal Reconciliation Liturgy at 7:00 PM at St. Rose of Lima Church, Hillsboro, with a couple of other priests available for Confessions. We will have Scripture readings and prayers together and individual confession, penance, and absolution. Additional times for Reconciliation will be on Wednesday, December 20th, from 5:00 to 8:00 PM at St. Rose of Lima Church, Hillsboro, and Friday, December 22nd, from 5:00 to 8:00 PM at St. William's, Argusville. --- Msgr.
