Fourth Sunday of Lent



We are now in the 4th Sunday of Lent, also known as Laetare Sunday or Rejoice Sunday. Why is it called this, if we are in the Lenten season? It is called such for several reasons: reaching the midpoint of Lent, as we approach the horror of the Passion of the Lord, we are not to lose sight of the promise of Easter, and the joy of the Resurrection! And so, we are given this "reprieve" in this sobor season of Lent.

Our Gospel emphasizes God's great mercy. The healing of the blind man, told so dramatically in today's Gospel, brings out the mercy and kindness of Jesus, "the light of the world." Isaiah prophesied, and the Jewish people of that era believed, that when the Messiah came, he would heal blindness and other diseases. Jesus gave to the blind beggar not only his bodily eyesight but also the light of Faith. This story also shows how the stubborn pride and prejudice of the Pharisees prevented them from seeing in the humble "Son of

Man" the long-expected Messiah, and that made them incapable of recognizing the miracle. The Pharisees argued that the healer was a "sinner," because the miracle had been performed on the Sabbath. But the cured man insisted that Jesus, his healer, must be a man from God, and they excommunicated him from Temple worship. When Jesus heard this, He sought and found the man He had healed, and asked him, "Do you believe in the Son of Man?" the man answered, "Who is he, sir, that I may believe in him?" In response to Jesus, "You have seen Him, and the One speaking with you is He," the now-sighted man said, "... 'I do believe, Lord,' and he worshipped Him."

Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord:

We will celebrate the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord on Saturday, March 25th. This great Marian feast observes "the visit of the angel Gabriel to the virgin Mary to inform her that she was to be the mother of the Savior" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, Glossary, p. 866). This is the first announcement of the Good News of the Incarnation, God becoming man in Jesus. This solemnity is not a Holy Day of Obligation, but it celebrates a very important event in the history of salvation, our salvation. Lent: Preparation for Holy Week

The prayers and penances which we do during Lent will help us to prepare for the celebration of Holy Week and the new life of Easter. During Holy Week, we celebrate the great saving events of the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus our Lord. We enter His Passion with Him. We suffer and die with Him so that we can rise to new life and be glorified with Him. Please make your best effort to participate in the liturgies of Holy Week.

Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession)

One of the best ways in which we can observe Lent and prepare for Easter is to participate in the sacrament of Reconciliation. Another way of putting it is to go to Confession. The celebration of the sacrament of Reconciliation includes confessing our sins, expressing sorrow for them, doing penance for them, and receiving absolution of them. The grace of Christ's forgiveness restores and deepens our friendship with Christ, brings about peace between us and Christ and His Church, sets us free, fills us with joy, and makes us holy and merciful people. One of the precepts of the Church is: "You shall confess your sins at least once a year" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, #2042, p. 493. This prepares you to receive the Holy Eucharist at least during the Easter season. I will have regular times for Reconciliation and additional times for Reconciliation, or you can contact me and schedule a time for Reconciliation. We will have a Communal Celebration of Reconciliation on Sunday, March 19th, at 7:00 PM at St. Rose of Lima Church. We will have Scripture readings and prayers together, and then, individual Confession and Absolution with one of the priests. --- Msgr. Skonseng
