

The Resurrection of the Lord
April 9, 2023



In the opening line of the gospel passage for Mass on Easter Sunday, we are told: "On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark." Can you imagine what was darting through the mind of this brave follower of Jesus on that somber, loveless morning? Her mind must have been filled with conflicting memories. There were cherished images of Jesus bringing life and hope to so many people whom he encountered, including her. But these memories were crisscrossed by the nightmarish images of Calvary: the deafening shouts of the crowds and the horrific sounds of hammers driving nails into wood. The dramatic events of Calvary had taken from her the one she had come to love and to follow. The darkness of that early morning hour reflected the darkness that enveloped her heart.

She and the other disciples discover, however, that Jesus is no longer a prisoner of the tomb. At first, she does not fully understand the wondrous event that has taken place. So she goes to share her news with Peter and the Beloved Disciple. The gospel tells us that the Beloved Disciple came, saw the empty tomb, and believed. The good

news of Easter begins to sink into the minds and hearts of the disciples.

We Christians celebrate this Easter Sunday as part of a wounded nation and a wounded world. We come at this time to profess our belief in the resurrection of the Lord. As Peter says in the first reading for today's liturgy, we have been chosen by God to be witnesses to the good news of Easter. Our belief in the resurrection does not give us easy answers to the profound questions occasioned by suffering. But our faith does give us the hope that there is a light shining in the midst of the darkness.

Alleluia! Alleluia! Happy Easter! Jesus is risen! "On this day of days, we offer a joyful sacrifice of praise to the Father who raised his Son from the dead. Let us be intent upon the life Christ offers us, Christ our Passover who has been sacrificed" (Order of Prayer in the Liturgy of the Hours and Celebration of the Eucharist 2023, p. 113). The first eight days of Easter, the Octave of Easter, are celebrated as Solemnities with the singing of the Gloria and the double Alleluia for the dismissal. The Easter season last fifty days. "The fifty days from the Sunday of the Resurrection to Pentecost Sunday are celebrated in joy and exultation as one feast day, indeed as one 'great Sunday' (St. Athanasius, Epistula festalis: PG 26, 1366). These are the days above all others in which the Alleluia is sung" (Order of Prayer in the Liturgy of the Hours and Celebration of the Eucharist 2023, Universal Norms, 22, p. 113). The graces of the Resurrection of Jesus our Lord are endless hope, comfort for our grief, courage to live our faith, light in the darkness, freedom from fear, victory over sin and death, many other graces, and eternal life. I pray that Jesus our risen Lord may fill you with the joy of the Resurrection! Alleluia! Alleluia! --- Msgr. Skonseng

The Divine Mercy Holy Hour

On Divine Mercy Sunday, April 16th, we will observe the Hour of Great Mercy from 3:00 to 4:00 pm in St. Rose of Lima Church. We will expose the Blessed Sacrament and adore Jesus, The Divine Mercy. Reconciliation (Confession) will be available from 2:00 to 3:00 pm. In His revelations to St. Faustina Kowalska, the Lord called for a special feast day to be celebrated on the Sunday after Easter. Pope St. John Paull II named the feast Divine Mercy Sunday at the canonization of St Faustina on April 30, 2000. The Lord said to St. Faustina: "I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and a shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment" (Diary, 699). A plenary indulgence is granted (under the usual conditions of a sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and a prayer for the intentions of the supreme Pontiff) to the faithful who, on Divine Mercy Sunday, in a spirit that is completely detached from the affection for a sin even a venial sin, recite the Our Father and the Creed, and also adding a devout prayer (e.g. Merciful Jesus, I trust in you!). About the Hour of Great Mercy, the three o'clock hour, the Lord said to St. Faustina: "At three o'clock, implore My mercy, especially for sinners; and, if only for a brief moment, immerse yourself in My Passion, particularly in My abandonment at the moment of agony. This is the hour of great mercy. In this hour, I will refuse nothing to the soul that makes a request of Me in virtue of My Passion" (Diary, 1320).
