July 23, 2023 Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time



All of the parables in today's Gospel are about the Kingdom of Heaven. That's how the parables started last week and today: That phrase (Kingdom of Heaven) is used 51 times in Matthew's Gospel. If that doesn't tell you to pay attention and think about it, nothing will. We need to be receptive to the Word of God to understand. Once our minds, our hearts, our imaginations, our souls are open, we can begin, with the help of these parables, to imagine the Kingdom of Heaven.

This "Kingdom of Heaven" embraces souls, not land and possessions. God's rule transcends the boundaries of time and space. The power and authority of God is not centered on domination, but in compassion and forgiveness.

When we look around, we begin to get the point of this week's parables. There are weeds here. It does not matter where they came from, but there are weeds. This world, this church, our lives are not perfect. What do we do about the

weeds? Jesus says, don't be upset or angry. There is grace, there is time, there is a patient God revealed by Jesus who waits for us to listen to his Son and work hard at getting ourselves in shape, preparing for the harvest. It is then that the weeds and the wheat will be separated, not now. Perhaps most importantly of all, we need to realize that we are not the ones to do the separating. That's not our job. We will have enough to do simply making sure that we are fruitful like the wheat.
