

## August 27, 2023 Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time



Jesus tells Simon Peter: "... upon this rock I will build my Church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it." Jesus' description of Peter's new job makes it clear how important it is, and how literally foundational. Upon a single rock Jesus wants to build His Church, and Simon Peter is the right man for the job. The Pope serves the Church as the "Vicar of Christ". Jesus' role as the Church's cornerstone is given concrete form in the person of the Pope who walks this earth. A vicar is one who speaks and acts in the name of a higher authority. So, the Rock who is Peter—through the office of the Pope—serves as the earthly, bodily representative of Christ, the cornerstone of the Church.

The occupant of Peter's chair is the Vicar of Christ not in bearing Christ's omnipotence, but in teaching in the current day what Christ has already gifted to His Church. Far from an exciting office of innovation, Peter holds down the Church against the currents of faddish ideologies and fashionable trends. If the Church were merely a building, this office would mean mere maintenance. But since the Church is something living—the Mystical Body of Christ—this office is a living mission.

Jesus didn't ask Peter to be a star, but a rock; not brilliant, but solid; not popular, but the unwavering voice of Christ to His People: the voice calling each person to take up his cross and follow Him.

Receiving both forms is a fuller sign of Holy Communion. You will be free to receive the Precious Blood from the chalice, if you choose to do so. The Church teaches that you receive the whole Jesus, Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity, when you receive either form of Communion. If you have a cold, sickness, or have recently been ill, please do not receive the Blood of Christ since we drink from a common chalice. #### **Eucharistic Adoration during National Eucharistic Revival**

We will have Eucharistic Adoration on the first Sunday of the month after the 10:30 AM Mass in both St. Rose of Lima Church and St. William's Church. This will begin on Sunday, September 3rd, after the 10:30 AM Mass at St. William's Church. We will alternate on the first Sunday every other month after the 10:30 AM Mass between St. William's and St. Rose Parishes. Adoration will be for a half hour beginning after the prayer after Communion. You may stay and pray for five minutes or for the full half hour. We will conclude with Benediction. I have decided to do this for our Parish Eucharistic Revival during the National Eucharistic Revival. The National Eucharistic Revival began on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) on June 19, 2022. It will end with the National Eucharistic Congress on July 17-21, 2024, in Indianapolis, Indiana. The purpose of the National Eucharistic Revival is to increase our devotion to the Holy Eucharist, deepen our union with Jesus Christ through the Holy Eucharist, heal divisions and bring about unity among the members of the Church, and empower us to bring Christ to others. I thought that having Adoration after the 10:30 AM Mass on the first Sunday of each month would provide an opportunity for more of the members of our parishes to pray to Jesus and be with Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. --- Msgr.
