# December 24, 2023 Fourth Sunday of Advent



A lesson we could take from today's readings for Mass, is first of all to *listen* to what God's will is in any given situation. That is so hard to do, because we want to do all the talking. Some of us are not very good listeners when we are around other people, let alone listening to God in prayer or for the Holy Spirit to speak to us during our day. We are too busy thinking about what else we need to be doing. We should think about following the examples of those in all the Readings, by setting aside a little time for quiet prayer and contemplation. We could try to be a little more aware of God's presence when we pray, and not do all the talking. God may have something to say to us too!

As we celebrate the Annunciation of the Lord and peer into the home of Nazareth where the angel Gabriel came to announce that the Savior was to be conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of Mary, let us see it as an invitation to deeper prayer.

#### Christmas, the Nativity of the Lord

We celebrate the Solemnity of Christmas, the Nativity of the Lord, on Monday, December 25th. In the Birth of Christ, the Word became flesh (John 1:14) so that we might share in the divine nature. The eternal Son of God became a little child so that we might become children of God. "Christmas is the mystery of this 'marvelous exchange': O marvelous exchange! Man's Creator has become man, born of the Virgin. We have been made sharers in the divinity of Christ who humbled himself to share our humanity" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, #526, p. 133). Let us rejoice at the Birth of Christ because in Christ, we receive grace upon grace. In Christ, we who are sinners become saints. In Christ, we receive the gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit. In Christ, we are merciful as our heavenly Father is merciful. In Christ, we receive eternal life. We praise you, "Jesus, Lord at thy birth" (Silent Night)! --- Msgr. Skonseng

#### **Schedule for Holy Day Masses during Christmas**

Solemnity of Christmas, the Nativity of the Lord Sunday, December 24 5:00 PM St. William's, Argusville Sunday, December 24 7:00 PM St. Rose of Lima, Hillsboro Monday, December 25 8:30 AM St. William's, Argusville Monday, December 25 10:30 AM St. Rose of Lima, Hillsboro

**Note:** The Fourth Sunday of Advent, December 24th, and Christmas, December 25th, are both solemnities (holy days) of obligation. The obligation for each solemnity must be fulfilled with a separate Mass. The obligation for the Forth Sunday of Advent may be fulfilled at any Mass from the evening of Saturday, December 23rd, and throughout the entire day of Sunday, December 24th. The obligation for Christmas may be fulfilled from the evening (after 4:00 pm) of Sunday, December 24th, and throughout Monday, December 25th.

# Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God

Sunday, December 31 5:00 PM St. Rose of Lima, Hillsboro Monday, January 1 8:30 AM St. Rose of Lima, Hillsboro Monday, January 1 10:30 AM St. William's, Argusville

**Note:** The solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God is not obligatory this year because it falls on a Monday, January 1st, a day after Sunday, December 31st, the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. The obligation for the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph may be fulfilled at any Mass from the evening of Saturday, December 30th, and throughout the entire day of Sunday, December 31st. Although it is not obligatory, you are encouraged for the spiritual benefits for you and others to participate in one of the Masses for Mary, the Mother of God on Sunday evening, December 31st, or Monday, January 1st.

#### **Christmas Gift to Parishioners**

On this Christmas, the members of St. Rose of Lima and St. William's Parishes will receive a gift from the parishes. The gift is the book, Beautiful Eucharist, by Matthew Kelly. It is to help us participate in the Eucharistic Revival which is taking place throughout the Catholic Church in the United States. The book is made up of reflections on the Holy Eucharist by several Catholics to tell us how Jesus is wonderfully present in the Eucharist to nourish and transform our lives. One book will be given for each household.

### Declaration of the Holy See, "On the Pastoral Meaning of Blessings"

If you would like to read the declaration, "On the Pastoral Meaning of Blessings," approved by Pope Francis, which explains the meaning and under what circumstances a blessing may be given by priests and deacons to couples in irregular situations and couples of the same sex, you may pick up a copy on the table near the entrance of the church. You may also read the declaration on the Vatican website.

#### Prayer and Reflection on the Holy Eucharist

Pray for the grace to grow in appreciation for the gift of the institution of the Eucharist by which you participate in the Passover of the Lamb of God. Lord God, may I grow to give you due honor and glory in thanksgiving for the eternal and loving sacrifice of your Son, the true Lamb.
