March 17, 2024
Fifth Sunday of Lent



In the Gospel for the Fifth Sunday of Lent, Jesus proposes a parable to help us understand how to live out our fundamental vocation to give of ourselves to others. Today's parable is the image of a grain of wheat being buried in the ground to die so it can bear much fruit. We can relate to this image even if we are not farmers because we don't have to travel far in our diocese to see lush wheat fields. These fields of wheat did not just become lush magically. A farmer buried these seeds into the ground, resulting in new life. Our Lord uses this image first for his disciples to foreshadow his paschal mystery, and second, this parable helps us understand that Christ's paschal mystery must be incorporated into our lives if we want communion with God.

The paschal mystery, which we prepare all of Lent to celebrate, captures the entirety of Christ's work of evangelization in the Gospels, and it is the mystery by which we are meant to be transformed and renewed. Pope John Paul II first used the term **New Evangelization**, which was encouraged by Pope Benedict XVI and Pope Francis. While Pope John Paul II first employed the expression new evangelization, the Second Vatican Council was deeply rooted in promoting the Church's missionary activity to evangelize all nations. John Paul II understood the new evangelization to be for those who have already heard the Good News and have been initiated into the

Mystical Body of Christ, but who need to listen to the message of the Gospel anew. The **new evangelization** is for us to be faithful to our baptismal identity.

As we continue our journey toward the Triduum, let us live out our baptismal identity daily; let us remember that Christ suffered, died, and rose again so that we might have communion with him and one day experience his eternal glory in heaven.

Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession)

One of the best ways in which we can observe Lent and prepare for Easter is to participate in the sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession). The celebration of the sacrament of Reconciliation includes confessing our sins, expressing sorrow for them, doing penance for them, and receiving absolution of them. The grace of Christ's forgiveness restores and deepens our friendship with Christ, brings about peace between us and Christ and His Church, sets us free, fills us with joy, and makes us holy and merciful people. One of the precepts of the Church is: "You shall confess your sins at least once a year" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, #2042, p. 493). This prepares you to receive the Holy Eucharist at least during the Easter season. The regular times for Reconciliation are a half hour before daily Masses on Monday thru Thursday, and one hour before the 5:00 PM Saturday Mass and the 8:30 AM Sunday Mass. I will schedule extra times for Reconciliation as we come closer to Easter. You can also contact me and schedule a time for Reconciliation. --- Msgr. Skonseng

Mission Trip with Friends of Chimbote

Ed and Rose Crotty, Rita Mootz, and a few of their grandchildren will be going on a Mission Trip to Chimbote, Peru, this summer from June 24-July 4, which is sponsored by the Friends of Chimbote. They will be joining a group form St. Anthony of Padua Parish, Fargo. Father Gerard Braun will be with the group and offer Mass daily. They will be building two new houses for families who are so poor that they live in huts made of reeds and sleep on the ground. They will also furnish these new houses with furniture, such as beds, chairs, and stoves, and other furnishings, such as pots, pans, dishes, and blankets. It costs \$5,000 for the materials to build one house. It costs \$1,000 to furnish each house. They already have \$5,000 to build one house. They are asking the members of St. Rose of Lima Parish to support them with our prayers and donations to obtain \$5,000 to build a second house and to obtain \$2,000 for the furnishings for two houses. Friends of Chimbote will send us pictures, before and after photos of them and their homes, of the families that we are helping.
