



FATHER MARTIN'S CORNER

SUNDAY REFLECTION: Luke 6:27-38 talks about loving our enemies and doing good to them. The life and ministry of Jesus speak clearly and show definitively the theological virtue of love. All that He did was to love. As He was sent by the Father out of love, Jesus exemplified what it means to love God, neighbor and self. Love demands us to do what is good, beautiful and holy. Love begets love. No matter what situation we are in, we are to love! It is easier said than done. But when we love, there is nothing to lose; there's nothing bad effect on our life but rather, we feel good about it. There is something undeniably good inside of us. It is because we love! It is because we are loved!

VIRTUE CORNER: In the Gospel, Jesus wants us to live out again the virtue of **Docility**. Why? Because it is willingness to be taught, open to take correction peacefully and listening to another person especially God's directions. Therefore, virtue of docility is required of us to respond to the teaching of Jesus to love no matter who they are and in whatever situation we find ourselves in.

SAINT FOR VIRTUE OF DOCILITY:



Saint Dominic Savio lived around 1842-1857 AD. One day young Dominic asked his teacher, St. John Bosco, to teach him how to be a saint. He eagerly listened to everything Don Bosco told him and put it into practice. He wanted Jesus and Mary to be his best friends and would rather die than commit a mortal sin. Several of the boys at the school admired Dominic and thought of him as a friend. He grew quickly in virtue because he was docile and obedient to all that Don Bosco taught him. His feast is celebrated on May 6.

PRAYER FOR DOCILITY: Dear Jesus, please give a heart willing to be taught so that I may love you and my neighbors.



RINCON DEL PADRE MARTIN

REFLEXIÓN DEL DOMINGO:

Lucas 6: 27-38 habla sobre amar a nuestros enemigos y hacerles el bien. La vida y el ministerio de Jesús hablan claramente y muestran definitivamente la virtud teológica del amor. Todo lo que hizo fue amar. Cuando el Padre lo envió por amor, Jesús ejemplificó lo que significa amar a Dios, al prójimo y a sí mismo. El amor nos exige hacer lo que es bueno, bello y santo. Amor engendra amor. No importa en qué situación nos encontremos, idebemos amar! Es más fácil decirlo que hacerlo. Pero cuando amamos, no hay nada que perder; No hay nada malo en nuestra vida sino que nos sentimos bien al respecto. Hay algo innegablemente bueno dentro de nosotros. ¡Es porque amamos! ¡Es porque somos amados!

RINCÓN DE LA VIRTUD:

SANTA VIRTUD DE LA DOCILIDAD:

Santo Domingo Savio vivió alrededor de 1842-1857 DC. Un día, el joven Dominic le pidió a su maestro, San Juan Bosco, que le enseñara a ser un santo. Escuchó con entusiasmo todo lo que le dijo Don Bosco y lo puso en práctica. Quería que Jesús y María fueran sus mejores amigos y preferiría morir antes que cometer un pecado mortal. Varios de los chicos de la escuela admiraban a Dominic y pensaban que era un amigo. Creció rápidamente en virtud porque era dócil y obediente a todo lo que le enseñó Don Bosco. Su fiesta se celebra el 6 de mayo.


