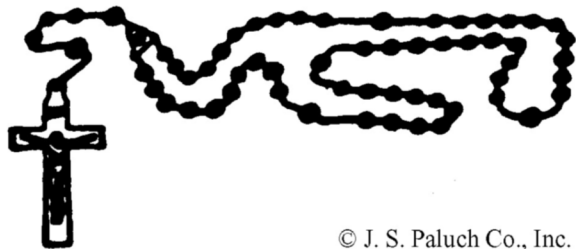

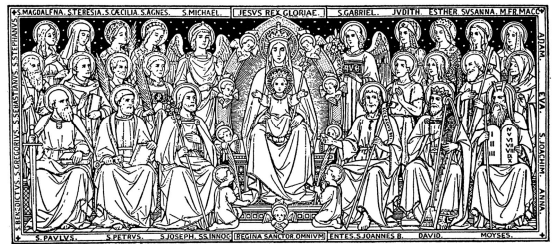
Holy Day of Obligation

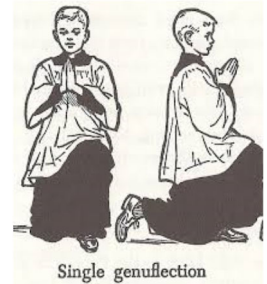

Liturgy of the Word

- ♦ Sit for the Scripture readings
- ♦ Stand for the Alleluia verse and reading of the Gospel
- ♦ When Deacon/Priest announces the Gospel, trace a cross with the thumb on head, lips and heart. This gesture is a form of prayer for the presence of the Word of God in one's mind, upon one's lips, and in one's heart.
- ♦ Sit during the homily

By the ritual gestures, we unite physically, mentally, and spiritually in our worship of the Lord. In part Adoremus.

TOO MUCH INFORMATION!

There is a common expression: "Too much information!" We usually use it when people tell us details about their lives that we don't want or need to know. Today, when James and John ask Jesus a simple question, making their request for places of honor in the kingdom, a simple answer might have been in order. Instead, as he often does, Jesus answers a question with a question; today it's about drinking the cup of suffering. Then, once the others are indignant over James and John's outrageous request, he proceeds to give them what may have been "too much information" for followers who were simply interested in the pursuit of glory. But this information, though it can sometimes seem "too much" for us, is essential for our lives as disciples. In Isaiah, in Hebrews, and in Mark today, we learn this information. It is in suffering, in weakness, in self-giving service to others, that we come to understand the kingdom. It is the information we need to find our place and come to be honored in the reign of God.

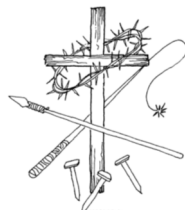

La Historia de Mission San Jose

In surveying the area for San Jose's mission village, the center of a selected site was used as the primary reference point. The 4 corners of the main plaza were then determined. Within the main plaza, outlines of specific buildings were set out by driving stakes to mark out the various buildings for the site. Master masons, master carpenters, and the Missionaries did the work of laying out the village.

From about 1721 through 1760, the village of San Jose was an open village arranged in blocks along streets. There was no enclosing wall surrounding the grounds and church as we see today.
