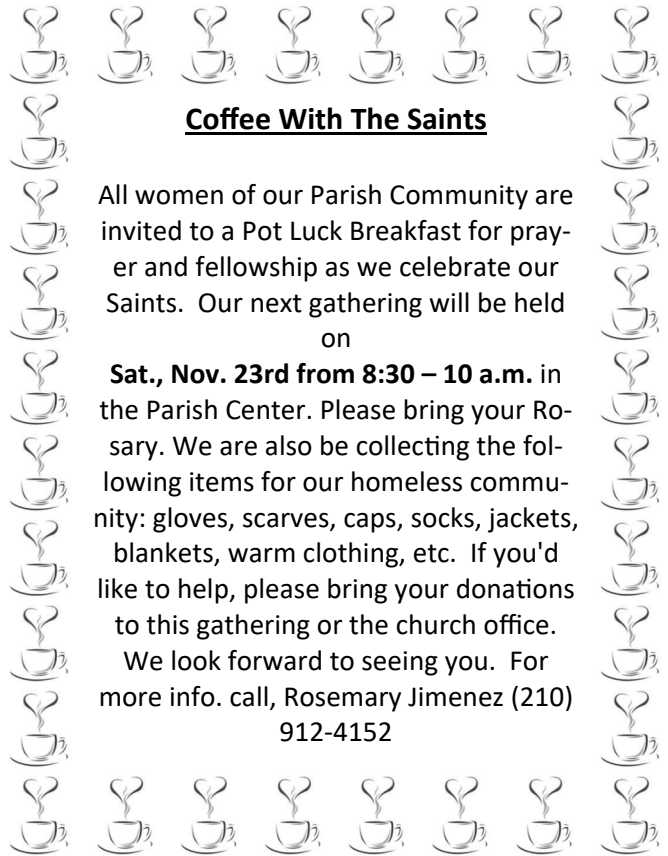

CONFIDENCE IN THE LORD

We are nearing the end of the liturgical year. Today's readings remind us that our own lives will draw to a close one day, and we can be certain that the Lord will encourage, strengthen, and save us—both now and at the last. The astonishing story of the Maccabees invigorates our faith as we behold an entire family willing to die rather than deny the Law of Moses. The psalm response echoes the faithful cries of the Maccabees: "I call upon you, for you will answer me, O God." That same confidence appears in Saint Paul's letter to the Thessalonians. "The Lord is faithful," he testifies; "he will strengthen you and guard you from the evil one." In the Gospel, Jesus explains just how long God's protection will endure. The children of God whom God guards, Jesus says, will live forever like angels.

Mission San Jose a moment of History...

Roofing systems – thatched roofs whether the building was a jacal, adobe, or stone, each could have several types of roofing, limited by the strength of the structures. Thatched roofs were cheap, took a short time to build, and required a low level of technical knowledge. They leaked easily, requiring a lot of upkeep. They were steeply pitched to allow for the speed of rainwater runoff, reducing the amount of water that could leak through. This roof was either gabled or made a shed like single slope. The gabled roofs had a triangle of rafters at each end of the building connected by a ridge beam. The ends of the rafters rested on wooden beams forming wall plates along the top of the walls. ated with lime plaster as a waterproof layer.
