in the Parish Center.

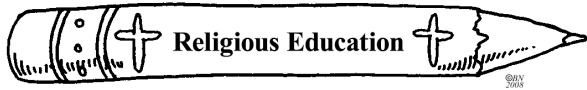
Please join us for our Saint discussion,

Amen.



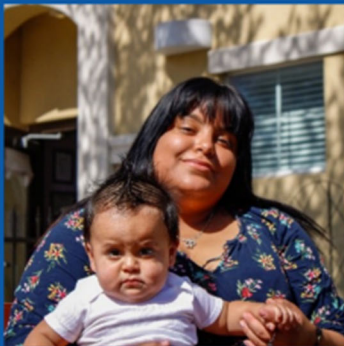
