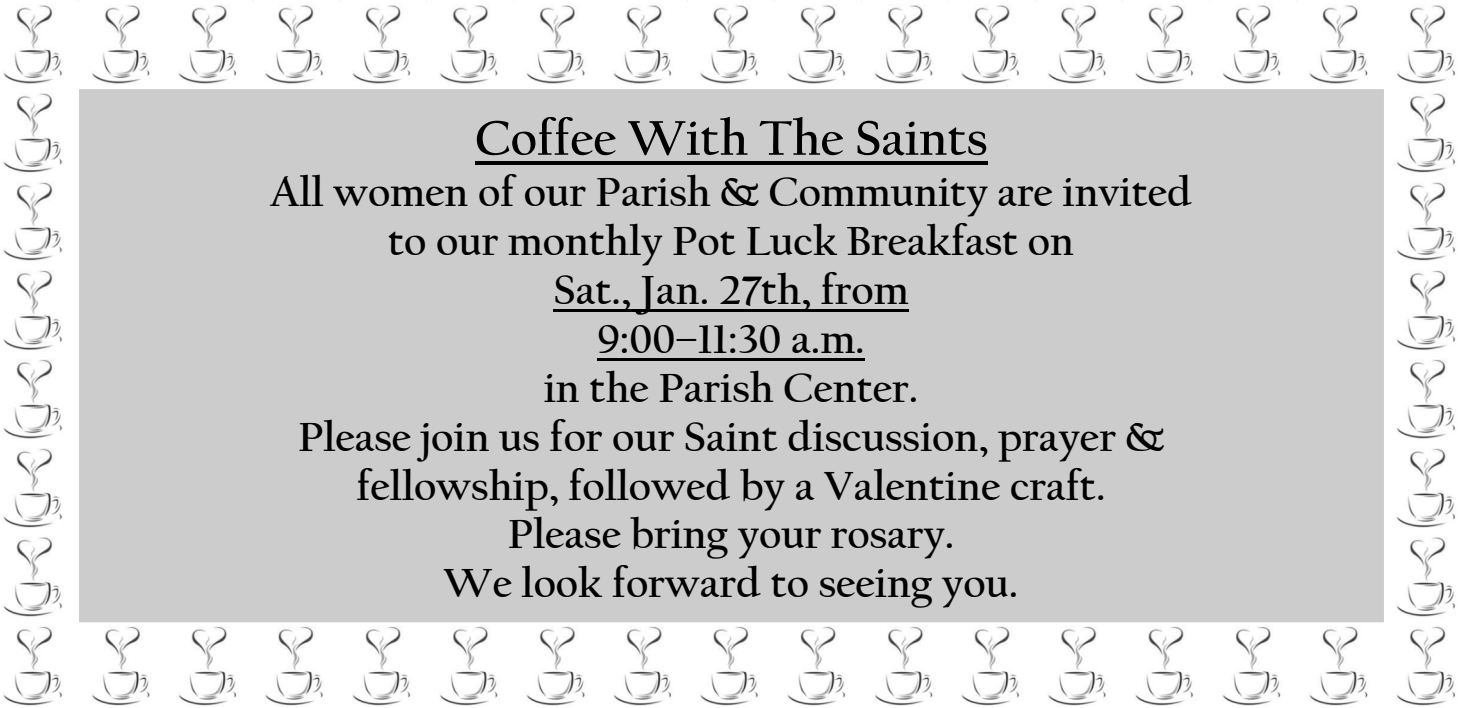

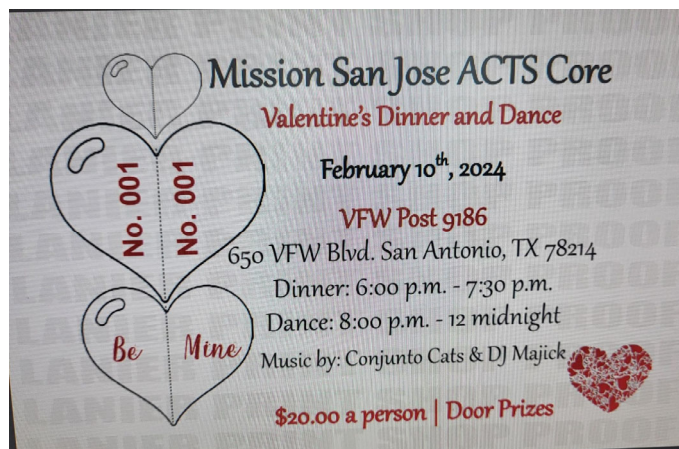

This week we finally put away all the Christmas decorations and we have entered Ordinary Time in the liturgical calendar of the Church. The term 'Ordinary' has many meanings in English. It can be something that is not unusual, is run of the mill. It can also refer to the leader of a diocese or religious community: The minister provincial of the Franciscans is our Ordinary; Archbishop Gustavo is the Ordinary of San Antonio. It can also refer to 'order', from which it comes. I believe this is the meaning intended when applied to our liturgical year; we move orderly through the days of the season. It is the day to day living out of the great mysteries of our faith. We have finished the season of Christmas, and the readings at Mass help us understand how to live out this good news. If we approach this time with intention and care, our faith and our relationship with God will deepen and strengthen.

When I was an undergraduate, I tended to study for tests at the last minute, cramming information so that I could pass tests. It worked, and I handily passed most tests. However, the information didn't stick; not only couldn't I remember it, but also it didn't change my life. Only later when I returned to the information with attention and a desire to see its relevance to my life, did the information change my life. We can be the same with our life of faith in the Church. The words of our weekly readings might just wash over us at Mass without taking root. But, if we take the words in, digest them, and pray with them, our lives will change immensely.

My prayer for us is that our 'Ordinary Time' will be an opportunity for us to revisit the Bible we have heard in the past and allow it to take root in our lives. It may be cold outside, but our lives will be warm if we do so. May God accompany us, guide us and lead us in this endeavor.

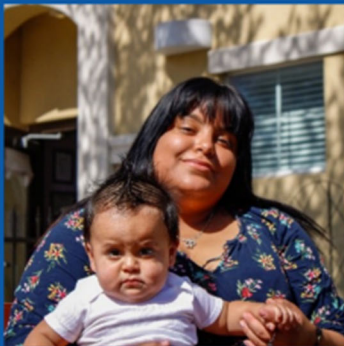
