

With the Lord there is Mercy and fullness of Redemption

The Response for this week's psalm points us in a new direction. We are not so much journeying through Lent and doing penance for past sins, as much as we are looking forward to Easter. The readings for this weekend focus on the mercy and redemption that will come to humanity with the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Christ.

The second reading can be confusing! "Those who are in the flesh cannot please God." This statement by St. Paul causes concern. I'm in the flesh; I have a body. Does that mean I can't please God? Well, St. Paul goes on to say that we are not in the flesh, we are in the Spirit. Where does this dichotomy come from? Paul is using concepts from Greek philosophy. To be in the flesh means that our human appetites rule us; we are not open to the things of God. On the contrary, to be in the Spirit means that we are living in the ways of God. We are responding to the teachings of Jesus. This doesn't mean that we reject the physical world, but that we recognize them as created by God as helps to our living in faith on our way to eternal life. We are in the Spirit thanks to our Baptism and Confirmation. With these two sacraments of initiation, we are aligned more closely with God. As we grow in the Spirit, in relationship with God, we become more aware of God's presence around us. The beauty of nature, the face of a loved one, the comfort we receive from others when we are suffering – all these are possibilities of recognizing God's presence. We journey through the world surrounded by the presence of God. This is what St. Francis wrote about in his *Canticle of the Creatures*. As he goes about the world, Francis blesses God **for** the things he has created and praises God **through** those same things. Even death is something to praise God for (as hard as that is).

"And Jesus wept." I am always touched by this very short sentence from the Gospel of John. At the start of the story, Jesus says that the illness of Lazarus was intended to show forth the power of God. Yet, when Jesus goes to the house of Lazarus and meets Mary and Martha, he weeps with them. Although we often feel bereft of God's presence in difficult times, especially in death, the fact that Jesus wept at the death of his friend tells me that he never abandons us. He is present in those times when we feel great loss, or when we feel abandoned. Jesus is not far, and in both his human and divine nature he cries with us; he shares our loss, our pain. It is because he loves us so deeply that he **must** be with us at all times. As surely as the presence of Jesus with Mary and Martha helped diminish their pain, so our pain lessens when we pray. Praying to Jesus and through the intercession of Mary we have the assurance of God's care for us in difficult times.

May we continue our Lenten journey, growing in the Spirit of God, reinforced by the love of Jesus.


St. Joseph

ASH WEDNESDAY
LENT BEGINS

WHAT IS LENT?
The 40-day period from Ash Wednesday and before Easter Sunday. It is marked by praying, fasting, abstinence, and other acts of penance.

WHAT IS FASTING?
One meal a day, and two smaller meals which if added together would not exceed one full meal.

WHAT IS ABSTINENCE?
Abstinence is refraining from eating meat. Meat is considered to be the flesh and organs of mammals and fowl.

DAYS OF FAST?
Ash Wednesday, Good Friday

DAYS OF ABSTINENCE?
Ash Wednesday, All Fridays of Lent, Good Friday

WHO ARE REQUIRED?
Catholics from age 18 to 59
The sick are excused from fasting

WHO ARE REQUIRED?
Mandatory for everyone
older than 14 years old
