

Attack? or Embrace?

The Gospel this week begins with Jesus prophesying his death at the hands of “men.” He doesn’t specify who these people are, therefore it’s an implication that all humanity plays a part in this murder. In the context of this violence and the end of Jesus’ life, the Gospel next includes a story about leadership and service among the disciples of Jesus. The disciples argue among themselves who is the greatest. Jesus responds that the one who wants to be first must put himself at the service others. He also says that we must receive all as a little child. A child – who is powerless, who needs protection and nurturing, over whom we have power and must exercise it with responsibility and respect. To those who view being a leader as equivalent to being a king or the general of an army, this might seem preposterous, foolish.

I wonder what the disciples thought about all this? First of all, Jesus reveals that he is going to be murdered and then rise on the third day. If I had left my job and family to follow Jesus, I would have been scared that I would be swept up in this violence. I would have wondered about the success of Jesus’ teaching if it would ultimately result in his death. And the promise that he would rise on the third day? Unheard of. How would I experience this? Would he return in vengeance to repay those who had killed him? And then he tells us to lead by serving and receiving those who are powerless. Jesus certainly sees the world in a different way than most people!

The first two readings for today resonate with the Gospel. The wicked people in the book of Wisdom say: “Let us beset the just one, because he is obnoxious to us.” The just one challenges our behavior and says he is protected by God. So, let’s beat him up, verbally and physically, and see what God does for him. I am disheartened that discourse in our society has embraced this negativity. Those who disagree label each other with invectives, unwilling to work together for the good of all. What a contrast this is to the teaching of Jesus.

Then the letter of James begins, “Where jealousy and selfish ambition exist, there is disorder and every foul practice.” Jealousy, at root, grows from a sense that another is better than I, that I am not good enough. That other person is better than I or has more or better things than I do, so I harbor jealousy and even hatred for them. Selfish ambition seeks to further oneself, and others usually suffer as a result. My work is only for my progress and forget how it affects others. These sins break down society rather than building it up.

I don’t claim that everyone sins in these ways, but I point to Jesus today. How do we lead our families, our church and our society by embracing the little ones, the powerless ones, the ones who need protection. I actually see this happening, and I see people who, even when they fail, want to follow Jesus. I thank God for our desire to build a better society, to be better people, to live out the Gospel. Thank you for your example to me.


Funeral Rites Part 2

Vigil Service (Wake)

"At the vigil, the Christian community keeps watch with the family in prayer to the God of mercy and finds strength in Christ's presence" (Order of Christian Funerals, no. 56). The Vigil Service usually takes place during the period of visitation and viewing at the funeral home. It is a time to remember the life of the deceased and to commend him/her to God. In prayer we ask God to console us in our grief and give us strength to support one another.

The Vigil Service can take the form of a Service of the Word with readings from Sacred Scripture accompanied by reflection and prayers. It can also take the form of one of the prayers of the Office for the Dead from the *Liturgy of the Hours*. The clergy and your funeral director can assist in planning such service. (Please note The Rosary is sometimes added as part of service)

It is most appropriate, when family and friends are gathered together for visitation, to offer time for recalling the life of the deceased. For this reason, eulogies are usually encouraged to be done at the funeral home during visitation or at the Vigil Service.
