

# This and That

We're down to the last few days before our <u>elections</u>. If you have not already voted, please make a plan to vote on Tuesday, November 5. It is our responsibility as citizens to exercise this right.

Mark your calendar: Last Monday several leaders of the parish met to begin planning <u>our parish community gathering</u>. The date for the gathering is **December 21**, and the meeting will go from **9:00 to Noon**. We'll begin with coffee and donuts, and end with a simple lunch. Archbishop Gustavo's message at the archdiocesan assembly focused on our mission as church. During the morning we will take steps to continue forming community in the parish: Who are we? Whom do we want to become?

Also, on December 8 at 3:00 pm at St. Mary University, COPS Metro will be celebrating 50 years of Community Organizing to Provide Service. All are welcome to join in this celebration.

## **Today's Gospel**

When I was a novice, our formation director called me to his office one day. His message was short, clear and fear-inducing: "We're thinking of asking you to leave the novitiate." I responded out of my experience: "But I've gotten A's on all the tests." He said, "That's true, you have knowledge but you're not living it out very well." I was devastated. So, I began to change, a change that continues to this day. It's the difference between *knowing about*, and *knowing*.

I could say something similar about beginning ministry to a Spanish-speaking community in Indianapolis. I began with knowing a lot about Hispanic culture, but it took the next nine years for me to begin to know the people and live within the culture. It was a blessed, if challenging, process.

Today Jesus talks about the two great commandments: love God, and love your neighbor as yourself. These two greatest commandments differ in kind from the Ten Commandments that we learned as children. The Ten Commandments are prescriptive – they tell us how to act. We can follow them and fulfill them yet remain a closed off person. We can obey the letter of the law and yet not embody the spirit of the law. Empty practice fulfills the letter but not the spirit.

On the other hand, the two great commandments of love that Jesus prescribes today go beyond the letter of the law. Love of God, love of self and love of neighbor demand knowing the other, not just knowing about them. Martin Buber, the great World War II theologian, describes it as the difference between a relationship described as "I and Thou," compared to an "I and it" relationship in which there is little connection to the other.

The Ten Commandments are wonderful guardrails in evaluating our actions, and we teach them to children because they are clear and measurable. What is not especially clear and measurable is the attitude that lies beneath these actions. How do I think/feel about God, about myself, about my neighbor? When I embrace this triad in prayer, concern and genuine caring action, I am moving beyond the letter of the Law.

We are a blessed community because we so often go beyond the letter of the Law. Thanks be to God! May this always be a hallmark of our community.

# Funeral Rites Part 5

# Cremation

The Church earnestly recommends that the pious custom of burying the bodies of the deceased be observed; nevertheless, the Church does not prohibit cremation unless it was chosen for reasons contrary to Christian doctrine. (canon 1176.3)

While the Church continues to hold a preference for corporeal burial, cremation has become part of Catholic practice in the United States and the around the world.

The Church's reverence and care for the body grows out of a reverence and concern for the person whom the Church now commends to the care of God. This is the body once washed in baptism, anointed with the oil of salvation, and fed with the bread of life. This is the body whose hands clothed the poor and embraced the sorrowing. The human body is so inextricably associated with the human person that it is hard to think of a human person apart from his or her body


The Order of Christian Funerals' Appendix on Cremation states: "Although cremation is now permitted by the Church, it does not enjoy the same value as burial of the body. The Church clearly prefers and urges that the body of the deceased be present for the funeral rites, since the presence of the human body better expresses the values which the Church affirms in those rites" (no. 413).


