Alive & living with Cancer

I was diagnosed with an aggressive form of prostate cancer in 2013. Since that diagnosis I had surgery five times, radiation, hormone therapy, and consulted with doctors at four different hospitals. I have felt hopeful, sad, fearful, fortunate, blessed, singled out, alone, and cared for. Sometimes all on the same day.

This experience has led me to ask if people who are living with cancer might benefit from a group where a person is free to express their experiences and the wide range of emotions that comes with living with cancer without judgment. I am willing to begin a discussion with others to explore what others would find helpful and would not be helpful. If such a group is going to be helpful we need the input of others. To begin the discussion I invite you to a meeting on

The Sign of Peace

The sign of peace in the Catholic Church is a way to express peace, unity, and charity. It's a brief, prayerful act that can be performed in many ways, including: Handshakes, Embraces, Kisses, and Bows.



The sign of peace is optional, but it's usually performed at Mass. The priest or deacon invites the congregation to exchange the sign of peace when it's appropriate.

Rules for the sign of peace

- **Who to offer it to:** Offer the sign of peace to people within your immediate vicinity, including people in front of and behind you.
- **How to offer it:** You can shake hands, embrace, bow, or make a small wave.
- **Who to acknowledge:** Offer the sign of peace to people over the age of two, but you don't need to shake hands with babies or very young children.
- **What to say:** You can say "Christ's Peace be with you".

When to offer it: The sign of peace is usually performed before the Lamb of God prayer.


