

We used a contemplative practice to discover God's personal message to each of us. Then in groups we discussed why we belong to the parish, what things can we improve, and what are the issues that our local communities face – what must be improved for the sake of our children and grandchildren.

Next week we'll publish a report on the day so all can read the results. This has been the second of such gatherings in the parish, and we hope to have more in the future. We are practicing synodality here in our community, forming ourselves not from the top down but from member to member. May God bless our continued response to His grace in our lives!

Honoring Br. Kevin

For almost ten years Br. Kevin served the people of Mission San Jose. A tireless worker, he started his day before others and ended after others. He was a loving presence among us and his wit lightened the days of many. He always made sure to visit all parish events and personally greeted almost everyone present.

As Br. Kevin left, he asked that no gifts be made to him personally, but that people might make donations for the care of the grounds. We are going to honor his request by establishing the Br. Kevin Lenihan, OFM Endowment Fund. The singular purpose of the fund will be the care of the grounds and the gardens at Mission San Jose Church. We will establish the fund with a one-time special collection and then add to it with a portion of the second collection at our weekend Masses.

So, next weekend, February 15-16, we will pass out envelopes that can be used to donate to the fund. We will then collect them the weekend of February 22-23. This initial collection will be the basis of the endowment and every year we will release part of the interest to pay for the care of the grounds and gardens. Going forward, we will dedicate 10% of our weekly second collection to the fund.








