It has been several weeks since I've written something for the bulletin. One week for a trip to Chicago for La Tiendita, and another in Cleveland to visit my family and participate in graduation at our Franciscan high school. And our parish has grown over the past months. We received brothers and sisters into the church at Easter, we celebrated Confirmation with several of our young sons and daughters, and we have had several baptisms. God is doing wonderful things in our parish!

Having just celebrated Pentecost, I am reminded of a song of adoration:

El espíritu de Dios está en este lugar.
El espíritu de Dios se mueve en este lugar.
Está aquí para consolar, está aquí para liberar.
Está aquí para guiar, el espíritu de Dios está aquí.

The Spirit of God is in this place.
The Spirit of God is moving in this place.
He is here to console and liberate.
He is here to guide; the Spirit of God is here.

The scriptures for the Solemnity of Pentecost tell us that the Holy Spirit comes down upon the disciples. They are filled with the Spirit, they are emboldened to go outside their place of comfort and safety, and they are given the ability to share the story of Christ so that others can understand it from their own experience, in their own language. With this the church is firmly established, and the mission Jesus gives his disciples to go to all nations and baptize begins.

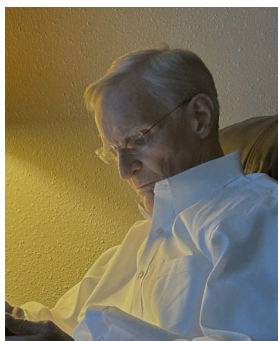
One thing to note is that the Spirit dwells **within** the disciples, and he also dwells **among** the disciples. What does this mean? The Spirit dwells in each individual present on Pentecost. The faith life of each person is changed, deepened by the presence of the Spirit. Each one's gifts for the good of the community become apparent, and they are each moved by grace. In their own way, with the talents that God has created in them and that the Spirit has strengthened, they serve the community and the entire world. But also, the Spirit dwells among them. And when they gather as a community the power of the Spirit is magnified in their prayer, in their concern for each other, and in their communal commitment to the Gospel.

We have experienced our own Pentecost and so, like the first disciples, the Spirit dwells **within** each of us. Each of you is given gifts for the good of the community. And, when we gather for Mass, or for our ministries, or even our social events, the Spirit is **among** us in our unity. So, I ask each of you to prayerfully consider which gifts God has blessed you with for the good of our community. And when we gather together, may we recognize the Spirit moving among us; may we recognize in each other the empowered gift of God for us.

I quote Archbishop Gustavo: "May this Pentecost rekindle your joy, renew your strength, and flood your lives with divine light. Feel embraced by the Holy Spirit – He who consoles, inspires, heals, and unites."

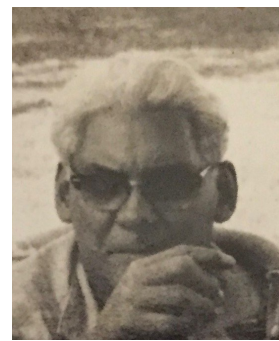

Let us praise those fathers who have lost a child to death, and continue to hold the child in their heart.

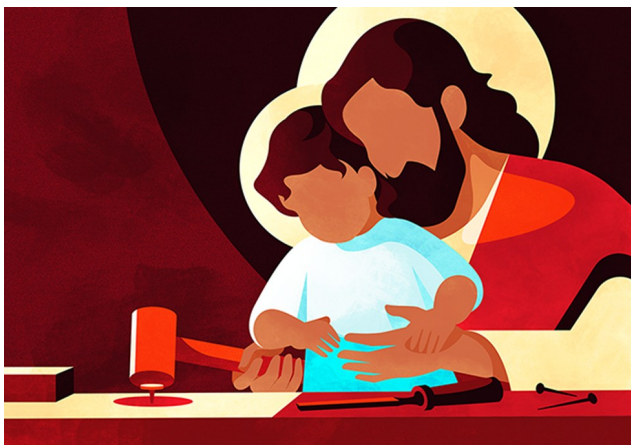
Let us praise those men who have no children, but cherish the next generation as if they were their own.
