Gifts of Life

When a person wants to join religious life she or he spends several years in formation. After a period of initial discernment in conversation with the order, they complete their application and take a psychological exam to evaluate their match with the life of a religious. They then enter formal formation. The first level is Postulancy, the name of which comes from the Latin word meaning, "to ask questions." The candidate spends a year or two living in community and asks questions in the face of the community's charism. The basic question is, "Who am I?" and the person comes to a deeper understanding of themselves in relation to religious life. What are my talents? Does this life help me to grow as a person and spiritually? Is my desire to be a religious a healthy choice for me? These questions take up this time. The second level is called Novitiate and entails a more intense living of religious life in community, studying the Rule of Life as confirmed by the Church, as well as how to read Scripture. At the end of this year the person makes promises to live the life of the Order for one year at a time. Some will continue to study theology in preparation for priesthood, others will continue religious life as a brother or sister. This is a time of continued discernment between the individual and the community. At the end of this time the person makes final profession, for the rest of their life. For Franciscans this is called Solemn Profession. This completes the time of initial formation and begins the time of ministry and ongoing growth in religious life.

This past year we have had the blessing of Br. Manuel living with us in preparation for his Solemn Profession. We will celebrate his profession on Monday evening, June 23, at 7:00 pm in the Church. This is a time of great celebration for the Franciscan Order and the Church. And we invite you to join us in witnessing his vows and celebrating with us. Please join us on Monday for the Mass of Profession, followed by a celebration with dinner in the parish hall.

With his profession Br. Manuel offers his life to God for the good of others. This weekend we also celebrate that Jesus gave his life completely for our life and salvation; so that we might be strengthened and nourished to live our life of faith. He so loved us that he gave us his body and blood for salvation. "This <u>is</u> my body; this <u>is</u> my blood." These words of Jesus at the Last Supper proclaim that what we receive is the true body and blood of Jesus. We receive God himself and Jesus enters into us to grace us for continued growth as a human being, as cooperating in the ongoing creation of the world.

May we approach communion with awe and respect, recognizing the great gift Jesus has given us by sharing himself with us. May the Eucharist never become commonplace in our esteem, and may we be for the world the life of Jesus which we have received.





To you our God, eternally blessed, be glory and praise for ever.


