

As St. Theresa of Avila notes, "Christ has no body now on earth but yours; no feet but yours. Yours are the eyes through which He is to go about doing good; yours are the hands with which He is to bless people now." Traditionally, stewardship has been thought of as giving of Time, Talent, and Treasure. At SMU Catholic, stewardship is lived in a different way: the action of Giving, the action of Praying, and the action of Serving. Together, we call these "GPS."
