# RECLAIMING MY CATHOLIC FAITH

# Week 5 Meditation on Temperance

Feeding a pet can be a moral act. We know what the pet often does not seem to realize that there are limits to what one should eat. If the pet can gain access to the food source it will eat to an unhealthy access.

Our senses (sight, smell, taste, hearing and touch) cannot be permanently satisfied. After a momentary satisfaction, they almost continuously desire more. The desire is known as an appetite. Often the physical sensation of satisfying the senses also gives a positive emotional response. The desire to receive emotional satisfaction is known as a passion.

Appetites and passions are powerful things. They can drive a human to make poor decisions. The ongoing and intensifying desire to satisfy our senses along with the weakening of the will and the clouding of the intellect is known as Concupiscence. Concupiscence makes it easier to give into temptation. In fact, each time we give into a temptation, it makes it easier to give into the same temptation or other temptations in the future.

Temperance is a moral virtue by which one voluntarily retrains potentially harmful impulses or inclinations.

Temperance differs from moderation in that a temperate person will not permit anything evil or allow any action that is morally wrong even in a moderate amount.

#### Specific applications of Temperance

- Abstinence moderation in food.
- Sobriety moderation in drink.
- Meekness restraint of anger.
- Humility restraint of pride for one's successes to the expense of other's/God's assistance in achieving excellence.
   Frugality restraint from wasting resources.
  - Chastity use of sexual desires/actions in accordance with creative love (reproduction).
    - Modesty moderation of clothing so as not to lead others into sin.

#### **Questions:**

Do I restrain myself from physically harmful things?

Do I resist temptation to sin?

Do I permit morally questionably behavior to exist?



#### What is an ACTS Retreat?

An ACTS retreat is a three day and three night Catholic lay retreat presented by fellow parishioners. The retreat begins on Thursday evening and ends the following Sunday at a Mass celebrated with the parish community. Retreats for men and retreats for women are given separately. Talks and activities during the retreat focus on Adoration, Community, Theology, and Service, from which the ACTS acronym is derived. Holy Scripture and the teachings of the Roman Catholic Church are the guides for the retreats. The retreat takes on the traditions and atmosphere of the parish community sponsoring it. The retreat facilitates the attainment of a new or deeper relationship with the Lord through:

Adoration - the call by, acceptance of, and response to God

Community - the love and caring of each other

Theology - the study of God through scripture and the Catholic Faith

Service - to God and his people.

Each retreat is conducted by a retreat "team" composed of 20-30 individuals who have attended prior ACTS retreats. Chosen by the retreat Director, the team organizes the retreat, conducts the retreat talks and activities, and ministers to the needs of the retreatants during the retreat weekend.

#### What is the purpose of the ACTS retreat?

An ACTS weekend is designed to help the retreatants enter into a new or deeper relationship with our Lord and fellow parishioners. This is accomplished through Adoration and daily prayer, the call to Community in one's parish as a member of the Body of Christ, and Theology in encouraging the study of scripture and our Catholic Faith, all of which emphasize and encourage the virtue of Service to our Lord, our parish, and one another.

#### What is the goal of the ACTS retreat?

A parish ACTS retreat strives to achieve the directives of Vatican II and goals of the Revised Code of Canon Law of 1983 which emphasize "community and pastoral care" within a parish. The weekend allows the retreatants to experience God's love and joy. They return to their parish with a deeper love for each other and a desire to become more involved in their parish faith community.

#### Why conduct an ACTS retreat?

The weekend is a powerful and enduring personal conversion experience. Talks, which draw from the personal experiences of team members, focus on Adoration, the need for prayer and meditation on the word of God, Community, the importance of community built on faith and love, Theology, the need to read and understand scripture and our Catholic Faith, and Service, the need to answer Christ's call to servanthood. Activities conducted during the weekend give retreatants a better understanding of the significance and importance of prayer, liturgy, the sacraments, scripture, community, and service. Retreatants are also given guidance to help them in their faith journey. It is a powerful community building experience. The ACTS weekend brings the retreatants to a better understanding of God's love for them, and also develops their need to share that love with others through their involvement in a faith-centered parish community.

The retreat emphasizes our call to service, service to the parish community and to our world community. There results a new or renewed dedication to the life of the parish community and a new recognition of the needs of those around us and of our obligation, as followers of Christ, to help meet those needs.
