


We wish Deacon Bill the best at his new assignment of St. Elizabeth of Hungary Parish in Crestwood. God bless you in your diaconal ministry!

The Assumption Shuttle!

Through the incredible generosity of a parishioner, Assumption has a shuttle available for our parish organizations and for seniors with mobility issues living within our parish boundaries. Seniors with mobility issues may schedule a ride to Holy Mass, parish activities and, if the shuttle is available, it may assist them with other needs.

Assumption Shuttle is used for these purposes:

- · Excursions for parish organizations.
- Transportation to and from Holy Mass, senior ministry events, and other parish events.

In the future we hope to add these services:

If the shuttle and drivers are available, seniors can request transportation to and from doctor's visits within a 10-mile radius or trips to the grocery store.

The following groups will have priority when scheduling:

- 1. Special events for parish organizations.
- 2. Transporting seniors and disabled to Sunday Masses
 - 3. Senior Ministry regularly scheduled events
- 4. *Maybe in the future:* Transporting seniors and disabled to doctor's visits
- 5. *Maybe in the future:* Transporting seniors and disabled to grocery store.

Assumption Shuttle will assist any senior living in our parish boundaries, but in cases of high demand, parishioners will be given priority.

All transportation is dependent on the availability of our volunteer drivers.

Rules:

- Only approved drivers may operate vehicle and wheelchair lift.
- Parish organizations must pay for any fuel they use (return shuttle with filled tank.)
- No food or drink (except in sealable containers)
- Passengers in wheelchairs may require another adult to accompany them to and from the shuttle.
- Ambulatory passengers must be able to board the shuttle unassisted.
- Seatbelts must be used at all times and passengers must remain seated.
- Passengers must complete waivers before initial use.
- Passenger recommended donation \$5 per ride.

For updates on the Assumption Shuttle register at <u>flocknotes.com</u> and join the group "Transportation Updates and News." Seniors and their caregivers are welcome to sign up to receive cancelations due to inclement weather and other relevant information.

To become a volunteer driver contact our transportation coordinator. We will train potential drivers and help them become qualified drivers.

These are the requirements:

- -Assumption driver's age minimum: 25 years old
- Valid Driver's License
- Proof of insurance
- Approval by the pastor
- Approval of Assumption Safety Coordinator
- Completion of Archdiocese of St. Louis Safe Environment Program

Once in a lifetime opportunity to hear and meet one of only 2 spiritual children alive today that knew Padre Pio personally. Adolfo had personal relationships with 2 great saints, Padre Pio and John Paul II.

Adolfo Affatato met Padre Pio for the first time when Adolfo was 16 years old. After his first Padre Pio Mass at San Giovanni Rotondo in 1953, Adolfo and a group of men were in the sacristy. As Padre Pio was leaving the room, he turned and said "Adolfo, come here". After several callings, Adolfo finally came forward from the back of the room, never having met Padre Pio before. Padre Pio said "I have been waiting many years for you". From then until now, Adolfo has spent his life devoted to this great saint. He is one of the last people alive today that had a personal relationship with Padre Pio. His testimony will inspire you.
