

Pastor's Column Fr. Thomas Keller



May, the Month of Mary!

The entire month of May is dedicated to the Blessed Mother. It is an old tradition linking the experience of Spring and the blossoming of flowers with our love for the Mother of God. It probably began in pagan times when weeks-long festivals in the spring celebrated fertility and new life. For many centuries, the Catholic Church took the natural inclination to celebrate the end of winter and the beginning of spring-time and linked it to the purity and chastity of the Blessed Virgin.

In the past, many parishes erected May Altars to honor the Blessed Mother and the faithful would adorn it with fresh-cut flowers. Sometimes, gardeners would cut the first flowers of the year and place them on the May Altar as a votive offering to Mary. Catholics would also spend a moment in prayer at the May Altar, entrusting their personal petitions to the Mother of God. Catholics also set up small May Altars in their homes. Small statues or paintings of Mary were honored in the home and fathers would kneel before the altar and lead their families in a daily rosary.

Sometimes, parishes would have outdoor Rosary Processions in May. Rosary Processions were often through parish graveyards to pray for the dead or through surrounding neighborhoods to witness to the Catholic Faith. Many times, these processions were inspired by the great Daily Rosary Processions in Lourdes, France to pray for the sick or Fatima, Portugal for reparation for sins. In fact, it was common for Midwestern parishes in the late 1700s and early 1800s to process around church property asking for protection from tornados. For many European settlers, the powerfully destructive Midwestern tornado was a new and much feared experience.

The biggest event during May was the May Crowning. This event was an all-female event (except for the priest.) A May Queen was selected from among the unmarried women in their late teens. The May Queen had a "court" of other young girls. Sometimes, the May Queen wore a crown of flowers and a long cape of red velvet. The image was intended to impress upon all the parishioners that earthly "royalty" still bowed before the Queen of Heaven. The May Queen would present an even more beautiful crown of flowers to the image of Mary, "crowning" the statue, as everyone sung "Bring Flowers of the Rarest."

On Mother's Day, Assumption will have a May Crowning at the 10:30 a.m. Mass. Our First Communicants (in their finest attire) will process to a May Altar to crown Mary. Then in the evening, at 7:15 p.m., everyone is welcome to join us for an outdoor Rosary Procession. Celebrate Mother's Day by honoring the Mother of Jesus!

The Assumption Shuttle!

Through the incredible generosity of a parishioner, Assumption has a shuttle available for our parish organizations and for seniors with mobility issues living within our parish boundaries. Seniors with mobility issues may schedule a ride to Holy Mass, parish activities and, if the shuttle is available, it may assist them with other needs.

Assumption Shuttle is used for these purposes:

- · Excursions for parish organizations.
- Transportation to and from Holy Mass, senior ministry events, and other parish events.

In the future we hope to add these services:

• If the shuttle and drivers are available, seniors can request transportation to and from doctor's visits within a 10-mile radius or trips to the grocery store.

The following groups will have priority when scheduling:

- 1. Special events for parish organizations
- 2. Transporting seniors and disabled to Sunday Masses
 - 3. Senior Ministry regularly scheduled events
- 4. *Maybe in the future:* Transporting seniors and disabled to doctor's visits
- 5. Maybe in the future: Transporting seniors and disabled to grocery store

Assumption Shuttle will assist any senior living in our parish boundaries, but in cases of high demand, parishioners will be given priority.

All transportation is dependent on the availability of our volunteer drivers.

Rules:

- Only approved drivers may operate vehicle and wheelchair lift.
- Parish organizations must pay for any fuel they use (return shuttle with filled tank.)
- No food or drink (except in sealable containers)
- Passengers in wheelchairs may require another adult to accompany them to and from the shuttle.
- Ambulatory passengers must be able to board the shuttle unassisted.
- Seatbelts must be used at all times and passengers must remain seated.
- Passengers must complete waivers before initial use.
- Passenger recommended donation \$5 per ride.

For updates on the Assumption Shuttle register at <u>flocknotes.com</u> and join the group "Transportation Updates and News." Seniors and their caregivers are welcome to sign up to receive cancelations due to inclement weather and other relevant information.

To become a volunteer driver contact our transportation coordinator. We will train potential drivers and help them become qualified drivers.

These are the requirements:

- -Assumption driver's age minimum: 25 years old
- Valid Driver's License
- Proof of insurance
- Approval by the pastor
- Approval of Assumption Safety Coordinator
- Completion of Archdiocese of St. Louis Safe Environment Program




