

Pastor's Column

Parish Fun-Raisers!

Every parish has events that raise money, but these events also give parishioners opportunities to work together, make friends, feel needed, and support one another. Annually, our biggest event is the Parish Picnic.

Catholic Parishes in the Midwest have a great tradition of picnics. They started out as a spring day when parishioners, after fasting and going to confession, received Holy Communion together (reception of Communion was infrequent in those days) followed by a big family-style picnic in the Church Yard. Men wore straw hats and women wore bonnets. Everyone sat around in the sun and ate and drank while some organized simple games for the children.

Then one day, somewhere, the pastor got a devilish idea and said, "Let's use the parish picnic to make money for the parish!" Dinners were prepared and sold in the church hall and booths were set up to play games of chance for children and adults. In some places, bingo was added. That pastor's idea caught on and spread from one parish to the next and eventually other pastors added parades, raffles, and traveling carnival rides and the modern parish picnic was born.

Assumption has a great parish picnic tradition. Our Chicken Dinners, BBQ and desesrts are amazing. Our volunteers are tireless and cheerful. Regardless of the weather, a lot of people participate.

Lately, we've added a pre-party the night before for grown-ups, an outdoor Saturday 5 p.m. Mass on the fields (as well as the regular indoor Mass in church) and fireworks to finish the evening!

It certainly helps if we make a profit, but what makes the Assumption Parish Picnic a success is how we pull together to make this a fun and exciting event for everyone!

Another great tradition is our Assumption Fish Fry! Obviously, some entrepreneurial pastor in ages past said, "The parish picnic makes money; let's monetize fish on Fridays too." Now, lots of parishes and Knights of Columbus halls have a Lenten fish fry. I've been a part of many parish fish frys, but nothing on the scale of Assumption's! Recently, it has blown up into a South County tradition! Just like the parish picnic, our fish fry each Friday of Lent is meant to be a fundraiser, but it is also a great community event that brings together parishioners of all ages, as well as Catholic and non-Catholic neighbors from all over South County.

Here's a quick report from our 2019 Lenten Fish Fry, courtesy of Josh Vautrain who kept track of this year's statistics:

- · Fish Fry sales in dollars are up 28%.
- · Concession sales increased by 9%.
- On our biggest night, we sold 1,364 meals.
- · Total revenue this Lent was \$101,302.
- · Carry Out meals were 19% of all meals.
- We reduced the average wait time in line to about 12 minutes.
- · Orders paid by credit card made up 33% of all orders.
- · We cooked 9,538 pieces of fish.
- · We fried 11,232 shrimp.
- · We served 18,560 hushpuppies.
- · We fried 197,000 french fries.
- · We served 620 lbs of coleslaw.
- · We served 120 trays of Bartolino's pasta.
- · We baked 135 pizzas.
- · We diced 294 eggs for salad.
- · We served 1,387 pounds of macaroni and cheese.
- · We served 1,401 pounds of green beans.
- · We prepared 10,063 desserts.
- Total profit to the parish from 2019: about \$40,000
- About \$4.57 of every dinner was income
- · Average income per week \$5,714

Thanks to all of our great parish volunteers who make Assumption the vibrant place it is!

RECLAIMING MY CATHOLIC FAITH

Reflection on Confirmation

One of the great tragedies of modern Catholic life is the lack of emphasis on the Sacrament of Confirmation. Admittedly, history has made this a difficult sacrament to explain. At one time it was administered with of the Rite of Baptism and First Holy Communion. So these three sacraments were easily understood when they were conferred together: Baptism makes you a child of the Father, Holy Eucharist unites you with Christ the Son, and Confirmation give you a share in the Holy Spirit.

Over the centuries they were split into our current form: Baptism usually at birth, First Holy Communion around 7 years of age and Confirmation, when one is in his or her teens.

Confirmation transmits the gift of the Holy Spirit to help the recipient live their Catholic Faith. Unfortunately, in an absence of good catechesis, a lot of wrong things have been taught about Confirmation:

- Confirmation is not a so-called "Rite of Passage" to Christian adulthood because even an infant can be fully initiated into the Christian Faith
- 2. Confirmation is not one's time to "choose Christ" because it is Christ who chooses us we only can respond to His call.

"By the sacrament of Confirmation, [the baptized] are more perfectly bound to the Church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit. Hence they are, as true witnesses of Christ, more strictly obliged to spread and defend the faith by word and deed." (Catechism of the Catholic Church #1285)

The soul of the Confirmed person is strengthened by the Holy Spirit through the transmission of **Seven Biblically specified Gifts** (*Isaiah 11:2-3*) identified as attributes of the Messiah, but through the sacrament, are given to the members of the Church. They are known as the 'Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit'.

These Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit are:

- 1. **Wisdom**, which detaches us from the world, making us delight in and love only the things of heaven.
- 2. **Understanding,** which helps us to grasp the truths of religion as far as is necessary.
- 3. **Counsel**, which springs from supernatural prudence, and enables us to see and choose correctly what will help most to the glory of God and our own salvation.
- 4. **Fortitude,** which gives us courage to overcome the obstacles and difficulties that arise in the practice of our religious duties.
- 5. **Knowledge,** which points out to us the path to follow and the dangers to avoid in order to reach heaven.
- 6. **Piety,** which inspires us with a tender and filial confidence in God, makes us joyfully embrace all that pertains to His service.
- 7. And lastly, **fear of the Lord** (wonder, awe), which fills us with a sovereign respect for God, and makes us dread, above all things, offending Him.

One of the most ancient prayers of the Church goes like this: "Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and enkindle in them the power of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created, and you shall renew the face of the earth."

Questions for Reflection:

Do I spread and defend the Catholic Faith by word and deed?

Do I cultivate the Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit in my life?

Do I invite the Holy Spirit into my life regularly?


