Maintenance Updates

If there's one thing I know, it's that Assumption never sleeps and Assumption is always undergoing change. A lot of people ask if summers are quiet at Assumption – well, it all depends on what one considers quiet! The grade school kids are away and some monthly meetings slow down over the summer, but the ELC is still here, Camp Assumption is going strong, Vacation Bible School is gearing up, the Adoration Chapel is always open, and Masses and Confessions never stop!

There are a lot of hard working committees at Assumption, and one of the hardest working is the Maintenance Committee. These guys have a long-term plan for Assumption including the upkeep of the buildings, care and replacement of critical systems, and improvements throughout the campus. Like every year, they have a lot of plans for this summer.

We hope to replace the carpeting in the school office. That carpet is really old and well worn. Two summers ago, we repainted the school cafeteria and replaced the tables. This year, we hope to renovate the cafeteria restrooms. Those restrooms have seen a lot of service and most of them have original hardware. We hope to paint school stairwells and replace all the school interior lights with energy-efficient lighting. There's always tuck-pointing needing to be done on the bricks throughout campus. Every year, a portion of the parking lot requires re-sealing. We also hope to renovate a restroom in the Salesian House, which is frequently used by our Eucharistic Adorers.

All these improvements are paid for through budgeted capital improvements. Thanks to all who give to our weekly Offertory Collection and to our ongoing *Preserving Our Heritage Campaign*! These improvements and repairs would not be possible without your generosity.

The 2019 graduating class has donated two new water fountains for the school. We hope to install them this summer, too. Thank you to the parents of the

graduates who were very gracious at their children's graduation and who worked hard to raise the money for this kind gift to the school.

The biggest project is expected to start sometime in autumn. With an influx of vehicles, our maintenance committee recommended that we build a large garage. We are planning on a 60 x 42 foot building that will house our pick-up truck, the Assumption Shuttle, the big orange Kubota tractor, our Boy Scout trailer, and all of our riding lawn mowers. This building will be located down by the current maintenance building and behind the Outdoor Classroom. It will be on generally unused space so it should not take up any of the parking spaces by the fields. This project will be paid for from our Beyond Sunday returns. Thanks to all those who pledged and supported Beyond Sunday. We have been able to accomplish a lot with the 40% that returned to Assumption! Thanks!

We intend to eventually move our picnic items into the new garage. If we do that, we can begin to use the old white "Knobbe" House behind the rectory for meeting space, or we can knock it down and use that space for something else. If we keep it, it is going to need extensive renovations. If we raise it, well, that's expensive too. I don't know... I'm open to suggestions!

If you have some background in anything having to do with construction, renovations, electric, plumbing, HVAC, carpentry, mechanics, technology, or any other trade or skill that might improve or help us to maintain our Assumption infrastructure, please let me know, as you could be a great addition to my advisory Maintenance Committee! They meet on the 4th Tuesday of the month at 6 p.m. in the Rectory Basement. The committee members offer a wide range of help, ranging from advising to rolling up their sleeves and getting the work done themselves.

We are very grateful to them for performing an incredible amount of work throughout the year for the parish!

RECLAIMING MY CATHOLIC FAITH

The Reasons for Mass

One of the questions nearly every child asks is "Why do we have to go to Mass?" This is a very good question! It also is intuitive, since a child may not see any purpose to attending Holy Mass.

It is also a very difficult question many adults may have answering.

The first parental response it often one of authority – "Because I said so."

But often a parent may reach into their experience to try to explain why it is important.

In these cases often their response is because they find it inspirational, or comforting or have some other encouraging reason. The problem is that the child may not agree with this experience. Often the parent resorts to "you get out of it, what you put into it" and they leave it at that.

In fact, the Catholic Church gives four reasons for Mass. None of them have to do with what we get out of it.

The four reasons for attending Holy Mass are:

- 1. The Mass offers perfect Adoration (love) of God.
 - 2. The Mass gives perfect praise to God.
 - 3. The Mass makes perfect atonement for sin.
 - 4. The Mass gives perfect thanks to God.

The Church also supports these for reasons by saying we OWE God these four things. It is our duty to give God adoration, praise, atonement, and thanksgiving because God has created us and He has redeemed us.

It is our duty to offer these four things each Sunday at Holy Mass when the Church celebrates the Resurrection of Jesus on the First Day of the Week. Failure to offer God these acts of love, praise, atonement and thanks constitutes a sin, unless we have a serious reason for our absence.

The Mass can offer these things "perfectly" not because our parish liturgies are perfectly performed, but because they are a participation in the adoration, praise, atonement, and thanksgiving that Jesus Christ gave the Father while He was suffering on the Cross.

In addition to the perfect participation in Christ's sacrifice, the Mass gives us an opportunity to offer ourselves to the Father with Jesus Christ, even if it is imperfectly. It is imperfect because our wills are weak and imperfect and our actions are less than perfect, even if we try real hard. Each Mass can be offered for a specific intention; it can be offered for ones self or for another person living or dead.

We also go to Mass to receive grace. Grace is an invisible gift of God's eternal life. The Holy Eucharist preserves us from evil and sin. It strengthens us for the journey of life to eternal life. It commits us to a life of charity. It expresses our unity with the Trinity. It expresses our unity with other believers in the Mystical Body of Christ. Finally it expresses our anticipation of the Second Coming of Christ.

Questions for reflection:

Am I committed to Sunday Mass —which includes the Saturday evening vigil? Why do I go to Mass?

Have I taught others the proper reasons to participate in Mass?





something to eat yourselves?" and he shows them how by the multiplication of the five loaves and two fishes. Because of your continued generosity to the Society of St. Vincent de Paul know that the multiplication of the loaves and fishes will happen again and the hungry will be fed.
