RECLAIMING MY CATHOLIC FAITH

What is the Holy Eucharist?

One problem Catholics may have is fully understanding the terminology the Church uses to describe what we receive at Holy Communion. There are several words or phrases that refer to the exact same thing. These terms are: Eucharist, Blessed Sacrament, Sacred Hosts, Body of Christ, Bread from Heaven, Precious Blood, Blood of the New Covenant, Sacred Species, and Real Presence.

What happens to the bread and wine mixed with water that we present at Mass? Since earliest times, Christians understood that once the bread and wine was "offered" to God, it ceased being the natural elements of bread and wine, but fully contained everything Jesus Christ is: his humanity and divinity.

During the offering at Mass, the priest invokes the Holy Spirit to change the bread and wine into the "body and blood of Jesus Christ." This invocation is followed by the words of Jesus himself from the Last Supper, where he took bread and wine, promised that it was his body and blood and he asked the disciples to eat and drink it. These words are known as the "Consecration."

The Consecration changes the bread and wine into the physical and spiritual reality of the God made man, Jesus Christ. Christians do this because Christ himself commanded us to do this.

Philosophers and theologians have given a name to this process by which, through the Holy Spirit, ordinary bread and wine become the Divine Presence of Jesus. They call the process "Transubstantiation." "Trans" meaning to change. "Substantiation" refers to the "substance," or basic reality of a thing itself. So at Mass, the substances of bread and wine are changed into the Divine Substance of the Crucified and Risen Christ.

From the moment of transubstantiation, the Eucharistic species are treated with royal dignity and worshiped, as they are now a revelation of God Himself. The Sacred Hosts (formerly bread) and Precious Blood (formerly wine mixed with water) are now the living presence of Jesus Christ. Specifically, it is the Crucified, Risen and Ascended Body and Blood of Christ who returns to be with the Church "under the veil" of the Sacrament.

Catholics physically express adoration for Christ in the Sacrament by kneeling in the presence of, genuflecting when passing, gazing at when praying, and respectfully handling when receiving the Blessed Sacrament.

The Blessed Sacrament is reserved in a special place in church called a Tabernacle. The Tabernacle is usually associated with the Altar of Sacrifice and located near or on it. In recent years, the Tabernacle may be located away from an altar, but that practice is quickly being abandoned because of the obvious link between the Eucharistic Sacrifice and the reserved Sacrament.

Questions for Reflection:

- 1. Do I respect the Holy Eucharist when I enter and exit the church?
 - 2. Do I speak reverently about the Most Holy Sacrament?
 - 3. Do I direct my prayers to Christ present in the Tabernacle?
